



A Letter from the Pastor



Greetings to everyone here at Fairview United Methodist Church, and to our community beyond in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Advent and Christmas are upon us. During this important season, we remember that the story of the birth of Jesus is without a doubt the most incredible gift the world has ever known. It is a gift which reminds us that we matter to God, and God loves us!

It is also a time to remember that God calls us to share and spread that love. In the opening of John's Gospel, he places the birth of our

Lord and Savior in its cosmic scope, saying what has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overtake it (John 1:4,5). Today, we are bearers of that light and we are called to bring it into our world.

Thus, it is a time to be the loving and welcoming people Christ calls us to be. The people of Fairview are often called "the Fairview Family" and that name exists for a reason! Here you will find a loving community from many different backgrounds and walks of life who will welcome you with open arms!

All of this thinking reminds me of my own journey. I think back several years, and my wife and I were "church shopping." We visited a United Methodist Church for the first time around the holidays. It always feels a little strange and even nerve-wracking going into a church where you don't know anybody. But then during what we call the "Sharing of the Peace," a moment in the worship service where we share the peace of Christ and greet one another, I was utterly amazed at how so many people went out of their way to greet us and introduce themselves to us. All it took was a brief moment like this to no longer feel like strangers!

Then we came back on Christmas Eve, and as the lights in the sanctuary were dimmed, and we lit candles to share the light of Christ while singing Silent Night, I felt such a deep sense of connection to all those people THROUGH Christ, that I knew God was calling me to join the United Methodist Church. Friends, that same spirit of love and connection is here and thriving at Fairview United Methodist Church, and we pray that you will consider being a part of it!



As you know, the clientele receiving pantry food has enlarged considerably, ever since we began serving on Wednesdays from 6 pm to 8 pm. The count is often in the neighborhood of 30 families per visit on those days. It takes a lot of energy to serve, keep the shelves stocked, tear down boxes for recycling, and secure more food to replace that which is served.

That is why we are asking you to consider helping keep the pantry going. As we go into the winter months, we will need more soups and canned goods to fill the shelves.

If you are able, please continue bringing canned goods and other necessary items to fill our shelves. These items are greatly appreciated.
