### A Letter from the Pastor

Greetings to everyone here at Fairview United Methodist Church, and to our community beyond in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. I pray that the love of God, the Hope of Emmanuel, and the Spirit of New Life abide with you as we enter into this new year. Indeed, it is my hope that everyone reading this newsletter will experience the joy of Jesus in your hearts and homes this holiday season.

It is mildly amusing to think that it isn't even mid-winter yet! The cold temperatures of the past few days may only be a preview of what is

to come! Even as I'm sitting here in my home office writing this letter, I'm aware that there's a winter storm just over the horizon. And even though I'm not a big fan of the cold weather and driving on snowy or ice-covered roads, the contemplative in me is quite content. I do love winter, with its silence and stark landscape devoid of distractions. The night sky is incredible with bright stars and planets, an image of tranquility in the midst of the chaos of the city and life in the fast lane. Let us seize these quiet moments when we can... bask in the wonder of the seasons and the beauty of God's creation!

But if this winter has you a bit on edge due to the lack of sunlight or bored because of being cooped up indoors, you're welcome to be a part of the exciting things we have going on at church! On January 1<sup>st</sup>, we will be having a very special "Covenant Renewal Service." This service goes all the way back to the founder of the Methodist movement, John Wesley himself. He introduced it in 1775 as an important part of spiritual life in the Methodist Societies. This renewal service was a time for the Methodists to gather

annually in a time of self-examination, reflection, and dedication, wholly giving up themselves and renewing covenant with God. Repentance through confession and commitment was a key focus of the service, calling for humility from those willing to submit themselves to the dynamic words stated within the liturgy. It will be a powerful way to begin the new year!!

Then, on Sunday, January 8, I will be beginning my most ambitious sermon series to date! The series is entitled "Hello God? We've got questions!" and it's based off a survey that was done a while back among United Methodist youth and children and the questions they had about God. For five weeks, your pastor and resident theologian will be tackling the questions that topped that survey, questions like "Can God Change People's Minds about how they act?" and "Does God have a purpose for my life?". In just a few days, we will have a video trailer of the sermon series available on our Facebook page. This would be a great time to invite either your skeptical friends and family members to church...or those who might be in a place of asking questions and seeking answers about their spiritual paths. All are welcome to be a part of this important conversation!

And it IS MEANT to be a conversation. Now, as many of you know, I was recently laid up with a major health concern in the weeks leading up to Christmas, so I haven't yet had time to bring this full plan into fruition.....but my HOPE is to make this an INTERACTIVE sermon series. I will be working with Roger Christian and Lee Kreider to develop a weekly YouTube series for the duration of the main sermon series that will examine YOUR questions about God and life.

We're setting up a new email address, info@fairviewunitedmethodist.org for this express purpose. You can send us YOUR questions for a chance to have them answered on air during this weekly series. So think about it. If you have questions about God, the Bible, church, theology, or life questions.....all of it is fair game! Send it our way!

It has been a great year at Fairview. Our grant application to the Northwest Dayton partnership was approved, and we have received \$26,000 in new funding. Work on the expansion of our food pantry has already begun in earnest. We've welcomed several new friends into our Fairview family this year, and we will officially have a New Member Reception sometime soon. We've grown our presence in the community. Word about our unique traditional worship is spreading. It is a great time to be a part of Fairview, and I'm excited about what 2023 holds for us. Indeed, in just a few weeks we will be beginning our vision casting process for the church, a process which will ultimately include all of you!

I thank God for the privilege of another year serving as both your pastor and friend. I love all of you and let us all join together in praying for more great things in 2023!

## Grant Allows Dayton Church To Expand Its Ministry



In Dayton, Ohio, a United Methodist Church food pantry serves the community twice a week and once a month on Saturday. Managed by volunteers, the pantry serves an average of 50 families per month.

At the Fairview Dayton United Methodist Church food pantry, there was a desire to increase the operating hours

to expand its reach into the surrounding community. The vision for the pantry required more funding for updates to the pantry to make it a reality.

Northwest Dayton Partnership reached out to community churches, including Fairview, to apply for \$40,000 in grants available for ministries and initiatives that have a positive impact on Dayton area communities.

Northwest Dayton Partnership is a cross-sector effort to engage residents, parents, government, schools, nonprofits, neighborhood groups, and faith-based organizations to work on community solutions together.

Fairview applies and was awarded a \$26,000 grant for their food pantry. The grant will allow the ministry to upgrade the HVAC system, add a refrigerator unit to offer fresh food and hire a part-time coordinator. The pantry hopes these changes will allow the pantry to increase operating hours and the number of families served each month.




