A Letter from the Pastor



Greetings to everyone here at Fairview United Methodist Church, and to our community beyond in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. As I write this letter to all of you, I am almost surprised to see the sun shining and that the temperature is all the way up to the fifties! Lent has always been one of my favorite seasons in the life of the church, not only because of the symbolism and traditions but particularly because the earth around us mirrors the season. On Ash Wednesday, when we recognize our own mortality with the sign of ashes, the earth is still barren, coming out of the winter season.

Each week as we progress toward Palm Sunday and Holy Week, nature becomes more alive, as spring emerges. We celebrate Jesus' resurrection on Easter Sunday with the symbols of bright flowers, marking the rebirth of creation, noting that nature mimics the renewal and new life we find in Easter.

I of course know how fast-paced and hectic life can be. Indeed, there are times when Lent gives us an opportunity for personal renewal, to renew things within ourselves which have become dormant, diminished, depleted, and stretched thin. Even being stuck in rush hour traffic can be an opportunity for prayer and devotions.

This, then, has become my focus and goal for the season of Lent. While some might give up chocolates at this time, I would offer a slight word of caution against that practice. If we're not careful, our spiritual practice can become just another menial task that we need to check off on our to-do lists.

Thus, I am using Lent as my opportunity to slow down and draw closer to God. Just as we're about to reset our clocks for daylight savings time, let us now reset the spiritual rhythms of our lives. This is precisely why, after dealing with these serious health issues over the past few months, I've finally decided to take some time out for a Renewal Leave. I'm in need of rest, and in that rest, I hope to reconnect with God on a much deeper level.

Of course, as your Pastor, I will be trying to help all of you with this. In our Lenten sermons this year we'll be focusing on practical ways that we can respond to the temptations and challenges of our daily lives, while at the same time seeking God in the midst of all things. And of course, my door is always open if you would like any spiritual direction or counseling. Just give me a call or shoot me an email and we can set up an appointment!

I leave you with the words of my favorite Christian writer, the Trappist monk Thomas Merton once again on the meaning of Lent:

"The purpose of Lent is not only explation, to satisfy the divine justice, but above all a preparation to rejoice in His love. And this preparation consists in receiving the gift of His mercy–a gift which we receive insofar as we open our hearts to it, casting out what cannot remain in the same room with mercy. Our peace and our joy in Lent are a guarantee of grace."



YOU ARE INVITED TO SHARE IN THE EXCITEMENT!!

Those of us who were born into United States citizenship often take it for granted. We don't realize what it takes to become a citizen. Because Gerardine Shukuru is 18, she could not join her parents in a family citizenship program. Working with an attorney, she completed all requirements for citizenship including producing proof of identification and immigration, gathering her school history and getting FBI approval of her behavior. At the Federal Building in Cincinnati, she was examined and passed all the requirements for citizenship: both an oral test (100%) which included answering random questions such as "Who succeeds to the Presidency if both the President and Vice President are no longer available to serve?" And a written exam to prove her proficiency in English.

You can share in the excitement with our newest citizen by attending the Naturalization Ceremony for new Americans to be held at **Sinclair Community College, Building 12, Room 150** on **March 9, 2023** at **9:30 A.M**. You can witness her oath of loyalty and hear the words proclaiming her truly a citizen of the United States of America. No reservation is needed, but space can be an issue so come early. There may be security, so have identification ready.


