Greetings to everyone here at Fairview United Methodist Church, and to our community beyond in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. September always seems to carry with it a sense of new beginnings. The long days of summer slowly begin to shorten, children return to school, familiar routines resume, and before long we'll begin to see the first signs of autumn around us. There is something comforting about the rhythm of the seasons and the reminder that, as Scripture tells us, "for everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven."

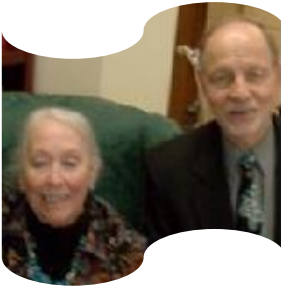

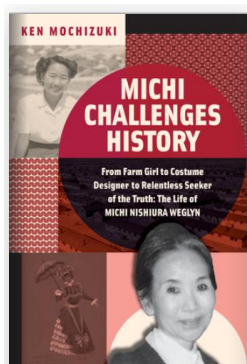
UNITED WOMEN IN FAITH BOOK REVIEW

Michi Weglyo was born as Michi Nishiura in 1926 in Stockton, CA. She was the first child & her sister the second that worked on the farm along with their parents as tenant farmers.

When WWII broke out with Japan after the attack on Pearl Harbor those of Japanese descent were herded into restrictive camps in AZ. for over 3 years. They lost everything!

Michi eventually was allowed to leave and go to college. She excelled and went into the career of costume design for ice shows and entertainers.

When the existence of the camps was not acknowledged, she felt compelled to leave her job and make it her mission to get the government to acknowledge the camps, the discrimination of the Japanese people and to secure reparations. This was the goal of the rest of her life. This is a model we all could follow, as her compassion reached out to everyone.

UNITED WOMEN IN FAITH STILL NEEDS ITEMS FOR 2 BABY BASKETS FOR WESLEY DAYTON

Fairview United Women in Faith has given 2 Baby Baskets to Wesley Dayton for several years. The baskets, filled with essential baby items, are given to the women who are enrolled in a training program to aid them in taking care of their newborn children.

Fairview United Women in Faith is requesting help to fill a basket for a girl and a basket for a boy. There is a Sign-up Chart at the church where people can indicate what they would like to give. **We still need people to sign-up to bring some items. The Sign-up Charts are in the Welcome Center through Sunday, September 13, 2026. Items should be brought to the church through Monday, September 28, 2026.** Items can be left in the laundry basket for Wesley Dayton.

The items needed for the baby baskets are:

- 1 Pack of Sleepers (2-3 per pack)
- 1 Pack of onesies (3-5 per pack)
- 1 outfit (often sold as a unit, usually with dress or pants with shirt and onesie)
- 1 pack of hats (0-3 months, 3-5 per pack)
- 1 pack of socks (4-8 pair per pack) size new born or 3 month
- 1 pack of diapers Size 1 (soft sided pack with about 62 diapers)
- 1 pack of baby wipes (about 56 wipes)
- 1 pack of baby towels (about 3)
- 1 pack of baby wash cloths (3-12 per pack)
- 1 pack of burp cloths (3-4 per pack)
- 1 pack of bibs (newborn, little, 3-4 per pack)
- 1 large blanket (handmade is welcome)
- 1 pack of receiving blankets (4-5 per pack)
- 1 rattle/small hand toy
- 1 small or medium baby-safe stuffed animal
- 1 Mother's Gift Card to Walmart (\$15)
- 1 Large Laundry Basket into which everything is placed
