## Some things to remember when visiting a reciprocal club:

- This activity is between two specific clubs who wish to offer the mutual exchange use of their facilities. *These reciprocal privileges are not intended to entitle guests to 'wholesale' use of the other's facility.*
- Under no circumstance should a WCYC member assume that all yacht clubs are reciprocal, and before requesting entrance into another yacht club, the member should check with WCYC to ensure that a reciprocal agreement exists.

**You will make your visit to another yacht club more enjoyable if you follow the simple rules of courtesy, as follows:**

1. Verify that you have reciprocal privilege before casting-off. ( See the West Coast Yacht Club Reciprocal list in the Binnacle and/or website.)
2. Call as far ahead as possible so that:
  - a. The host club can ensure space is available,
  - b. Your visit will not conflict with another host-club function, and
  - c. The host club can plan all other arrangements as necessary.
3. When making arrangements, ask about host club and marina rules & regulations pertaining to: a. Pets, b. Parties, c. Electrical service, d. Pump-out facilities, e. Shower facilities, and
4. Wear appropriate attire. Be aware of, and respect the host club's dress code.
5. Always sign the guest register. In some yacht clubs, this is mandatory.
6. Always have a current WCYC membership card. Be prepared to show it courteously to staff and members of the host club upon request.
7. Wear your WCYC name tag.
8. Be aware of, and respect the host club's policy regarding additional guests (your family and/or friends).
9. Ask for a copy or the location of host club rules. Observe them as members of their club must. Remember you are their guest and you represent WCYC.
10. Always be courteous to host club employees. Remember, their direction comes from their club officers and are not of their making. In addition, they give feedback as to how your engagement was with them. So we want WCYC to have a great reputation when visiting.
11. When planning cruise-type visits, make arrangements early in the year with the appropriate yacht club officials.
12. Patronize the facilities of the host club. They may have brought in extra staff and provisions for your visit.
13. Under no circumstances board or make fast to any vessel, unless specifically asked to do so or upon obtaining permission.
14. When in a visitor slip, do not rearrange, and under no circumstances use lines, hoses, power cords, spring lines, stairs, mops, kayaks, paddleboards or other materials belonging to the slip-holder without permission.
15. Many skippers leave lines, particularly spring lines, at their slips to assist their vessel in docking upon their return. Never use and most particularly do not re-tie these lines, as your action could cause serious damage to the slip-owners vessel and crew.
16. Follow good environmental practices consistent with concerns for proper trash disposal and discharges from your vessel into the water; leave a clean wake.
17. Write a thank-you note and mention any employees or members who were particularly helpful.
18. If approaching by sea, fly your burgee.

**Most clubs want you to visit their facilities. Traditional yachting protocol, courtesy and a thank-you will help them provide YOU a great yachting experience.**

The February meeting of the Southern California Yachting Association was the occasion for election of officers for the ensuing year.

The ever popular John Stick was elected Commodore. John, it will be remembered, served in that capacity three years ago. Irwin Jones was speared for Vice Commodore, and Emerson Spear Rear Commodore. Claire Neuner, of course, was elected Secretary-Treasurer for the umpteenth time. Hessel Taylor are the measurers again and yet.

Total D'Argent in treasury amounts to \$1344.51.

The San Louis Yacht Club has applied for associate membership in the SCYA. Their club boasts thirty members with an assortment of suns and snipes.

The chairman of the Midwinter Regatta (an ex-member of the Junior Chamber of Commerce) promised to be a good boy and not elect a commodorette for the Midwinter Regatta. The L.A. papers, as you may have seen, blossomed out with a picture of a redheaded commodorette and sundry fanfare. The buck and a lot of other hokum was passed around.

Chuek Ulman won the Ned Manning trophy with his "Doldrum".

It was decided that all perpetual trophies given by member clubs and SCYA should be accompanied by a remembrance trophy with name of yacht, name of perpetual trophy, year, and winning skipper inscribed thereon.

I C dinghy now numbers forty-six boats. The North American Dinghy Association recognizes this class and includes the history and pictures of races in the current yearbook.

The SCYA's request for a police boat to patrol yacht anchorages and prevent thievery has resulted in a deadlock between various "Dogs in the manger" at our great and glorious City Hall, and kindred dens of iniquity.

The exceedingly beautiful transpacific race perpetual trophy was appropriately presented to Harold Judson, owner of the Jory. Jud very kindly painted a vivid

word picture of being knocked down at sea in the dead of night. Amid the confusion to quote, "Everyone was running around in his birthday suit."

Norm Fabst, retiring Commodore, recommended that consideration be given to the idea of paying the SCYA secretary something for the tremendous amount of work he puts out.

### TAX ON YACHTS

There is a bill being presented to our State legislature which proposes that a one percent tax based on the market value of the yacht be levied per annum. This tax will take the place of the County and City tax, which now amounts to approximately 2½ to 3 percent of this value, and for which yachtsmen receive practically no benefit.

The State would disperse its collection to the bodies now receiving, but in a smaller measure, and 50 per cent of the revenue would be allotted to the harbor department.

John Stick says it will take \$500. to keep someone in Sacramento long enough to prevent this bill from being pigeonholed. It has been suggested that each club donate the same amount as is customary for the summer regatta trophies. It will no doubt be brought up at the meeting.






Imagine a sunny day on the water, you are fishing off of the kep beds of San Clemente, Bait tank running, Fish finder operating, and your VHF on, monitoring channel 16 in case of any emergencies. All of a sudden you hear a beeping on the boat and your like huh????!! You look over to your dash and see the low battery signal flashing on the VHF. You quickly switch your battery selector to the both and start up your engines.... Youre thinking what could be going on? Arent these batteries newerrrrr. Well come to find out after all the replacing we did with Jersey Girl, the one thing we hadnt done was replace the batteries, and what was typical running of the electronics for a boat trip that had occurred time and again, wound being a signal that its time to replace the batteries, yes they were actually over 4 years old and were 12 month batteries. Yikes!

I have passed on this fantastic resource to many members in the club, such as Tom Rasulo, Mike Sandler. But Beltran Batteries is an amazing small business. They will come to your boat and remove and install your batteries for you, most of the time free!! On Jersey Girl they drove down from Huntington Beach and removed and installed 2 group 27's for me as well as drove back up to Alamitos and installed a new U1 battery for the dinghy for Andiamo. Their pricing is unbeatable and they typically have 2 year warranties on all of their batteries. They carry AGM as well as Lead Acid. I highly recommend them. Boating safety is an important part of being a vessel owner. As an owner it is your responsibility to ensure the safety of yourself, family, and friends that you have as guests on your vessel.

The best way to do this is to have your vessel examined by the Coast Guard Auxiliary on an annual basis, ensuring that your vessel and safety equipment meets the current Coast Guard, State, and Federal requirements.
