


WCYC Heads to Del Rey Yacht Club For SCYA Angling Meeting!

Note: A simple method for checking a flame is to safety in the field. Turn on the hot burner of the furnace. If the safety in the flame after igniting the flame, then the safety in the flame is working correctly. If the flame goes out, then the safety in the flame is not working correctly.

Note: When repairing and MP control (C1500) is a small magnet. When high voltage occurs the magnet energizes the safety switch. When the magnet is energized the safety switch will open. When the magnet is de-energized the safety switch will close and you will have to turn the gas off at time of repair. If you turn off and on the meter.

Marine repair of the week....Those of you who know me know I'm constantly repairing items on the boats I own. It's a boat - so it's inevitable. Do you Have a 43 year old stove? Well chances are you can't get parts for it. On my oven the thermostat control was not working- pilot light would go on but gas would not ignite to bring up to temperature. After a bunch of deep diving into the internet, I found a company in Seattle that has video and pics of the various situations for my stove. I reached out to them and they sell rebuilt thermostat controls and you send yours in for a core exchange (otherwise you pay an additional \$120 for the part - The part runs about \$220). I have to say- a great find. They even included trouble shooting guide for other issues. The hardest part was fishing the thermostat through a tiny hole in the side of oven from the top. The oven was never used on this boat so it's basically new. So let's get ready for chocolate chip cookies or better yet a turkey dinner - Company contact info is in the post!

Boating safety is an important part of being a vessel owner. As an owner it is your responsibility to ensure the safety of yourself, family, and friends that you have as guests on your vessel.

The best way to do this is to have your vessel examined by the Coast Guard Auxiliary on an annual basis, ensuring that your vessel and safety equipment meets the current Coast Guard, State, and Federal requirements.
