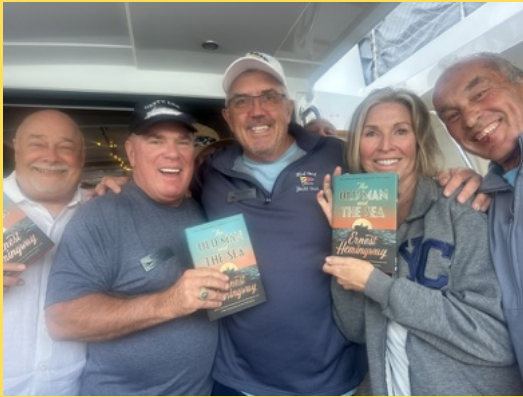

She is available for charter, with a vintage 1926 glamor all her own

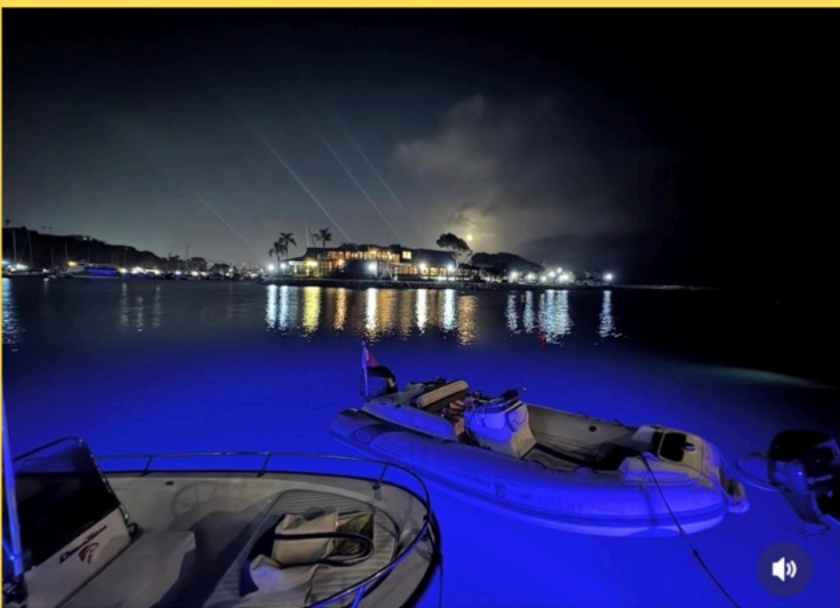

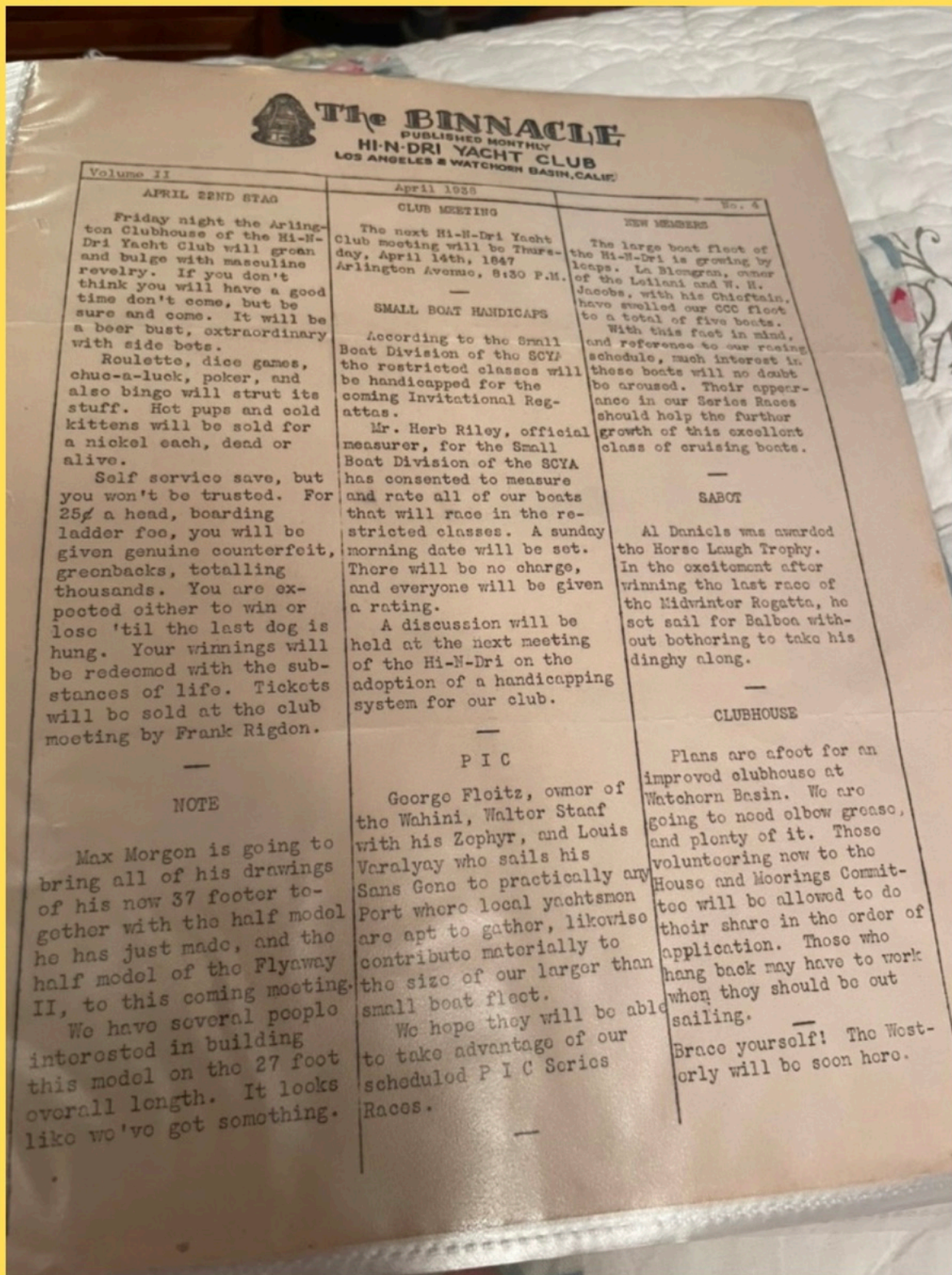

Self service save, but you won't be trusted. For 25¢ a head, boarding ladder fee, you will be given genuine counterfeit, greenbacks, totalling thousands. 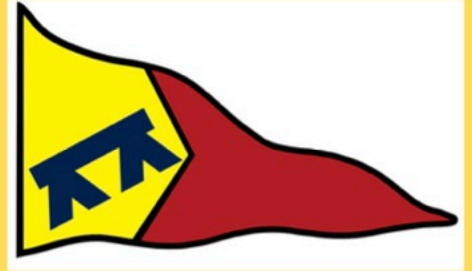
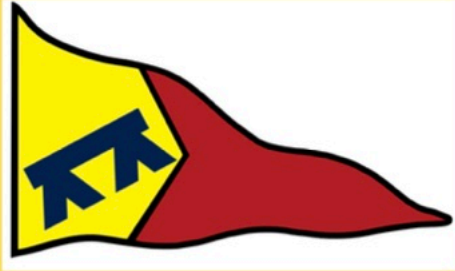
**CLUBHOUSE**

Boating safety is an important part of being a vessel owner. As an owner it is your responsibility to ensure the safety of yourself, family, and friends that you have as guests on your vessel.

The best way to do this is to have your vessel examined by the Coast Guard Auxiliary on an annual basis, ensuring that your vessel and safety equipment meets the current Coast Guard, State, and Federal requirements.
