The evening wound down with dancing from the live band, some black jack as well as a few of us soaking our toes in the nice warm water.


Once again, much thank you to the Monks for opening their home to WCYC.














Sailing the deep blue waters. Are you ready?

In 2014, the Coast Guard counted 4,064 accidents that involved 610 deaths, 2,678 injuries and approximately \$39 million dollars of damage to property as a result of recreational boating accidents.\(^1\) This report went on to find \(^1\)Where instruction was known, 23\(^2\) of deaths occurred on boats where the operator had received boating safety instruction. Only 12\(^2\) percent of deaths occurred on vessels where the operator had received a nationally-approved boating safety education certificate.\(^1\)
