Letter From Steve Fiorillo - VHF Automated Test Service Discontinued

Ahoy All!

I'm sure you're like me and that before heading out on a long journey with our boat I like to confirm that our VHF radio is in working order, and what better way to do this but with a radio check, right?

Well if you're heading out alone there's no one to call but other boaters or the CG. Unfortunately CH16 should not be used for radio checks, and rarely does anyone ever answer on 9 or 12. So where does that leave you?... CH27 of course and the automated radio check service. Well no more!

The automated service on CH27 was provided by BoatUS not the CG, and unbeknownst to me and perhaps you, was discontinued back in Oct of 2020, which explains why no one responds on that anymore either.

So what's the alternative? Well the CG suggests performing a radio check by testing your DSC function(if available) on your VHF radio.... See *USCG MSIB 20-20: Performing a VHF Marine Radio Check*, https://homeport.uscg.mil/Lists/Content/DispForm.aspx?ID=64920&Source=/Lists/Content/DispForm.aspx?ID=64920

Personally this seems a little dicey, because if it's not done correctly you could end up actually sending a distress call when there isn't one.


So for me, I guess I'll just keeping banging away on CH9/12 and hope for the best.



USCG AUX Bulletin Board - Vessel Safety Checks -



USCG Auxiliary Vessel Safety Checks Flotilla 06-08 – Dana Point



As April 12, 2021, the CG Auxiliary has moved into a new phase to align with the state's current risk level.

The following are the current guidelines allowing the CG AUX to conduct VSCs while conforming with the current social distancing restrictions. However, as with all COVID restrictions they are subject to change.

The new VSC guidelines include:

- As much as possible the exam should take place in the open air, however per the owner's permission, the examiner can now board the vessel to examine those items that cannot be brought topside
- One examiner per vessel
- Exam to be competed in 30 minutes
- Examiner and boat owner are to wear PPE and maintain social distancing of at least 6 feet

The CG AUX also have several resources where you can conduct a virtual VSC and prepare your vessel for the safety check.....
