As you can see, the harbor's pretty empty, so we were able to get the cans we wanted and stay all together.

As with the harbor, the town was pretty ghostly as well. Vons is opened for business, with plenty availability of most items including meats and produce. Most restaurants were still closed, though a few staples like Pete's, the small Antonio's, Maggie's, and Scoops (a necessity!) were opened for take out. On Saturday, consistent with L.A. County rules, Pete's and the Sand Trap, opened for outdoor dining, though most were still take out only. As the weekend approached more eateries and shops slowly came to life.


