LETTER FROM JAG/PARLIAMENTARIAN RICHARD HEPNER

RENAMING CEREMONIES

NAMING A VESSEL is a solemn duty, demanding that the vessel's owner contemplate the furthest recesses of the his/her mind, and the deepest fathoms of his/her soul. The name selected may reflect the character, profession, hobbies, sense of humor, mindset and/or aspirations of the vessel's owner.

RENAMING A VESSEL (removing the previous name and assigning a new name) implicates the Laws of Poseidon. As long as vessels have traversed the seas, sailors have known that renaming a vessel can not only bring bad luck, but renaming a vessel without consulting Poseidon will surely incur the wrath of the gods. When renaming a vessel, the owner of said vessel bears the responsibility to ensure that the name of said vessel is recorded on Poseidon's Ledger of the Deep in order to secure said vessel's safe passage throughout Poseidon's Domain. This involves the conduct of a Renaming Ceremony that pays homage to, and requests the gentle ministrations of Poseidon and the Four Winds. The Renaming Ceremony consists of two parts: 1) purging the vessel's previous name, and 2) renaming the vessel.



When assigning a NEW VESSEL its first name, for the above stated reasons, it is advisable to ensure that your new vessel is recorded on Poseidon's Ledger of the Deep. This involves a simpler, but no less solemn Naming Ceremony – no purging required.

Your WCYC Judge Advocate General/Parliamentarian is experienced in conducting Renaming Ceremonies, with a proven track record of appeasing Neptune and the Four Winds (Not a single vessel has been lost!). If you are planning to rename your vessel, please consult with your JAG/Parliamentarian.

- Vessel Safety Checks -



USCG Auxiliary Vessel Safety Checks Flotilla 06-08 – Dana Point



The following are the current 2022 guidelines allowing the CG AUX to conduct VSCs while conforming with the current social distancing restrictions. However, as with all COVID restrictions they are subject to change.

The new VSC guidelines include:

- As much as possible the exam should take place in the open air, however per the owner's permission, the examiner can now board the vessel to examine those items that cannot be brought topside
- One examiner per vessel
- Examiner and boat owner are to wear PPE and maintain social distancing of at least 6 feet
