LETTER FROM REAR COMMODORE DAVE STANCIL

Hello All:

New Boating Law- Effective 4/1/21

All of us should be aware of a new federal boating law that went into effect on 4/1/21 that covers the requirement of a ECOS (Engine Cut-Off Switch). A ECOS is a government acronym for what most of us know a "Kill Switch" which is probably mounted somewhere on your console of your inflatable, Whaler, or on your outboard motor. The scope of this article in our *Binnacle* is a broad brush of the details. If you want all of the details, see the link below.

The Kill Switch is a safety mechanism that will shut off the engine and prevent a runaway inflatable or Whaler that is very difficult to stop and can cause a propeller strike, collision, or injury to someone trying to stop the runaway boat. They may look a little different on each boat or outboard, but here is a photo taken of the Kill Switch on my 2.5 HP outboard that I mount on my inflatable.



The Kill Switch coiled lanyard is typically attached in some manner to the operator, his/her clothing, or the worn floatation device. The "red end" is sandwiched into the actual mechanism that is required to start the engine and with will cut off the engine when dislodged or removed. They are some newer non-lanyard model electric fobs that have entered the market. The law applies primarily to boat manufacturers that build recreational boats beginning in January 2020 less than 26' in length that have some source of power around 3HP. If the boat has an enclosed helm the Kill Switch is not required.

Regardless of the new law, the use of the Kill Switch is an important safety component that should **not be overlooked** when we are operating our inflatables or Whalers. We highly recommend that you attach it to your clothing when operating even for short distances while cruising the harbor or attending one of the WCYC raft-ups.

Letter From Steve Fiorillo

Ahoy All!

I just wanted to give you all an update on the Auxiliary's current protocols to perform Vessel Safety Checks.

As of April 12, our policies have changed and restrictions relaxed to better align with the current Risk Level.

So what does this mean to you, the vessel owner? Well there's no longer a requirement to perform certain parts of the exam virtually, and with the owner's permission, we're now allowed to board the vessel to view those items that are below decks.

However, we will still perform as much of the exam as possible from topside in the open air. All parties are still required to wear PPE, maintain social distancing, and complete the exam within 30 minutes. So having everything that's portable like flairs, PFDs, documentation, etc, be ready & available before the exam starts will help us meet these goals.

As always I encourage everyone to have their vessel examined. It not only ensures your boat is safe for you and you passengers, but it could reduce some hassles if you're ever stopped by the Coast Guard.

USCG AUX Bulletin Board - Vessel Safety Checks -



USCG Auxiliary Vessel Safety Checks Flotilla 06-08 – Dana Point



As April 12, 2021, the CG Auxiliary has moved into a new phase to align with the states's current risk level.

The following are the current guidelines allowing the CG AUX to conduct VSCs while conforming with the current social distancing restrictions. However, as with all COVID restrictions they are subject to change.

The new VSC guidelines include:

- As much as possible the exam should take place in the open air, however per the owner's permission, the examiner can now board the vessel to examine those items that cannot be brought topside
- One examiner per vessel
- Exam to be competed in 30 minutes
- Examiner and boat owner are to wear PPE and maintain social distancing of at least 6 feet

The CG AUX also have several resources where you can conduct a virtual VSC and prepare your vessel for the safety check.....
