To the WCYC Membership

This year has brought many changes and challenges for us all, and our club is no exception. Though we had to cancel several events, we were still able to have several cruises while keeping everyone safe, and plan to continue with the club's events following the recommended guidelines so to keep our club moving forward.

Unfortunately, we've been faced with some recent changes that should be brought to your attention. Firstly, Suzanne Gehret-Babcock has resigned her post as Treasurer. Secondly, Kevin Bertrand has also resigned his post as Vice Commodore. We would like to thank both Suzanne and Kevin for their efforts and participation in serving their positions in the WCYC tradition.

Due to the timing of these resignations, the board had to make some choices in order to maintain the continuity of the club infrastructure. Since the treasurer position is an active one and requires regular involvement, the board felt that this position had to be filled immediately. So in accordance to Article II, Section 8 of our bylaws, the board has appointed Christie Threlkeld as Treasurer for the remainder of Suzanne's term.

Regarding the vacancy of the Vice Commodore position, the board has asked David Monk to serve a second term as Commodore, to which he has graciously agreed. With David continuing as Commodore, this would advance Rear Commodore Mike Sandler to Vice, and Fleet/Port Captain Dave Stancil to Rear as per protocol. The action of a Commodore serving two terms has precedence, 1931-33, 1934-37, and 1954-55, and as per Article II, Section 5 of the current bylaws, an elected official may hold office until their successor is elected, but for no more than 2 years.

That said, the board has approved David's, Mike's, and Dave's nominations for the 2021 Flag Officer positions. These 2021 nominations will be voted upon and ratified as usual by the membership at the annual Holiday Brunch in December, along with the appointment of the new Fleet/Port Captain and any other vacant board seats. The Staff Commodores as of now will remain the same for 2021

We'd like to thank both David and Christie for willingness to keep the WCYC leadership team in tact.

Funeral services were held at Forest Lawn Covina hills in the Meditation garden on September 22nd.


Ross and Renee had the vessel "Arr & Arr" in Dana Point harbor. Ross had been battling Cancer for over a year at the time of passing.



USCG AUX Bulletin BoardVessel Safety Checks -



USCG Auxiliary Vessel Safety Checks Flotilla 68 – Dana Point

The following are the current guidelines effective August 1, 2020, allowing the CG AUX to conduct VSCs while conforming with the current social distancing restrictions. However, as with all COVID restrictions they are subject to change.

The new VSC guidelines include:

- Each VSC must also have prior approval by the CG AUX approximately one week prior to the exam
- One examiner per vessel
- Exam to be competed in 30 minutes
- No boarding of the vessel
- Examiner and boat owner are to wear PPE and maintain social distancing of at least 6 feet
- All vessel safety equipment (PFDs, flares, fire extinguishers, holding tank seacock, sounding devices, etc) must be available for either physical or virtual(FaceTime/Skype/Zoom/Pictures) inspection

The CG AUX also have several resources where you can conduct a virtual VSC and prepare your vessel for the safety check.....
