LETTER FROM THE EDITOR BRYAN CHALAIS

Greetings to all!

After finishing up the Danalina season opener last weekend, all I can say is "what a blast"! Friday was my first occasion on helping with the anchorage of our boats for a safe weekend afloat together. In setting anchors, my take away is my dinghy needs more horsepower!! A 5hp Honda just doesn't cut it when hauling out heavy anchor rode (I could see Brian Randall aboard Jersey Girl laughing at my full throttle attempts). Overall, it was a nice weather day, and the wind was cooperative while we went to work securing our anchorage.

The wind and weather kicked up Saturday, but spirits were high while Commodore Tom Rasulo and Vice Commodore Brian Randall did a great job with their presentations of declaring the 2025 WCYC season open! And with each important announcement came the roaring blast from Nick Papageorges' cannon fire, that awakened all who were near in the harbor! Finally with Sondra Harrison's touching invocation prayer, let there be no doubt, divine guidance and support is with WCYC on our 2025 journeys.

I have to fairly document a WCYC vessel rescue in the harbor on Saturday. It seems a couple boats from Dana Point Yacht Club were at anchor nearby when it became apparent their anchors had fouled and the boats were tied together and adrift. To make matters worse, their stern anchor line was tangled in the harbor buoy. While they frantically made their attempts, hope was beginning to be lost last they drifted towards the rocks in front of their yacht club building. Sensing danger, a distress call was made to the local authorities by our brave Commodore Tom Rasulo, who received a radio reply of "let us know if they get close". Dissatisfied with that response, the order was given to provide rescue assistance. Mike Sandler and Tom Rasulo made way to the boats in distress, and with Sandlers muscle power, the anchors were hauled up and untangled and the day was saved. The DPYC boats were able to re-set their anchorage and all was well. Later, the authorities arrived, full throttle, Code 3 lights and siren, other than disturbing the harbor with their wake, their assistance was unnecessary as tragedy had been averted by the quick thinking and brawn of those involved.

DPYC the next day showed up with cases of beer in appreciation for the help from WCYC. A great gesture indeed but we all know in this boating world, anyone of us could have been in similar hardship, and camaraderie amongst yacht clubs is a strong one and turnabout assistance would have of course, been generously given.

Looking forward to seeing everyone at the Catalina Wine Mixer at the end of the month!

Please RSVP to the EVITE by May 15th so we can plan accordingly.









2025 USCG Auxiliary Vessel Safety Checks Flotilla 06-08 – Dana Point



Boating safety is an important part of being a vessel owner. As an owner it is your responsibility to ensure the safety of yourself, family, and friends that you have as guests on your vessel.

The best way to do this is to have your vessel examined by the Coast Guard Auxiliary on an annul basis, ensuring that your vessel and safety equipment meets the current Coast Guard, State, and Federal requirements.
