Corruption - Killer of Development

Arguably we are only seven months into the Barbados Labour Party Administration so it is left to be seen whether the Administration will make good on its promise to deal with corruption and the abuse of the public purse. Barbadians must ensure that they are not distracted by the arrival of garbage trucks, buses or police vehicles. The arrival of equipment to Barbados from foreign countries has been a feature of Barbados Government activity from the time Barbados was settled as a colony.

Corruption is a major challenge to all governments. While accusing past administrations of robbing the treasury provides good fodder for election campaigns the real test is whether the Government of the day will pass the necessary legislation and enforce it. The Government in a moment of political generosity invited all political parties, and other members of civil society, to make submissions on the Integrity in Public Life Bill to the Joint Select Committee of Parliament (JSCP). The United Progressive Party (UPP) made substantive comments with recommendations for the improvement of the Bill. The Bill proposes that the Minister of Finance and the relevant Minister take more well defined responsibility for the activities of the SOEs with the attendant penalties for default. This is appropriate since it is often through their interference that poor decisions have been made in the past. The Bill still languishes in the JSCP.

One of the areas addressed by the Public Finance Bill is the more effective financial management of State Owned Enterprises (SOEs) with a special category for Commercial State Owned Enterprises. SOEs include entities such as the Productivity Council, The Defence Force and the National Sports Council. The Commercial SOEs include the Barbados National Terminal Ltd, Barbados Water Authority, Barbados Port Inc., Kensington Oval Management Inc., Sanitation Service Authority and the Transport Board

There is no doubt that poverty and corruption go hand in hand. Corruption in public office stands directly opposed to entrepreneurship and innovation when only those who finance campaigns see the real benefits of government facilitation. Corruption stands opposed to small business when politicians ensure that tenders are far outside the reach of small businesses no matter how efficient or skilled the workers might be. The IMF has instructed our Government to address corruption but the Public Finance Bill now joins the Integrity in Public Life Bill as they both languish in a JSCP. Is the JSCP the place where Bills seeking to address endemic corruption go to die?
