Services

JNC is a local rehabilitation center providing treatment for drugs and alcohol. They are based on the 12-step philosophy of AA and NA focusing on healing and life-long recovery where the mind, body, and spirit are taken into account. There is residential treatment in a home-like environment for a 28-day period which involves counseling, support groups, exercise, and goal setting. Intensive outpatient is also available for those who cannot take off work or have families to support. JNC also offers recovery homes for up to an 18 month stay after treatment. Financial assistance is available for those who qualify, and a referral is often needed to enter the program (usually from hospital, doctor, recovery coach, etc.).

Services

This is an alcohol and drug rehabilitation center aimed at helping adolescents, adults, and their families recover from substance abuse using a holistic approach. It is in network with the HSHS hospital system and Prevea Health. It is an outpatient program only at the Green Bay location. Individual and group treatment options are available with licensed professionals. A psychiatrist is on staff as well. There are financial assistance options, such as their Community Care program where proof of income is needed (tax return). Medicaid and an uninsured discount are offered.

Services

This is an acute care facility providing services for people who are in a crisis, pose a threat to themselves or to others, or are struggling with mental illness. Alcohol and other drug abuse (AODA) services are offered here as well. Brown County residents are accepted and served regardless if they have insurance or not. Medicaid/Medicare is accepted, and a sliding fee scale is available as well.

Services

24/7 counseling services over the phone or in person is provided for crisis situations. They are trained to aid with finding immediate solutions and referrals, cope with stress, and to follow up on the crisis intervention plan. This particular location is open to residents of Brown County. No appointment or referral is needed. Crisis counseling is free.

Outpatient counseling is available for anyone (adults, children, families, alcohol/drug addicts, and more), and group counseling and support groups are available as well. Appointments are needed. Inpatient services are for

children aged 10-17, and referrals are accepted from all 72 counties in Wisconsin. Outpatient and inpatient programs accept Medicare, Medicaid, and most other insurances. There is also a sliding scale for those uninsured. The lowest rates are \$90 for initial evaluations, and \$70 for each session after. Intern counselor may be available for the uninsured for \$5 per session.

There is a dental clinic, WIC center, clinic at NWTC, and mental health program that includes therapy, medication management, and substance abuse counseling. Spanish interpreters are available. You must pay for your services based off of your income (proof needed, such as check stub or tax return), called a sliding fee scale.
