Transformational Justice

- Solitary confinement tour
- Efforts to close Green Bay Correctional Institution (GBCI) through town halls and vigils outside the prison
- Work to reduce mass incarceration through TAD (Treatment and Alternatives Diversion)
- Partnerships for holding prayer circles in hopes of reducing community violence

Housing


- Housing Policy Institute to gather educators and community members in one space to train on housing law, advocacy, and sharing your story
- Work with the Greater Green Bay Blueprint to Prevent and End Homelessness
- Began a subcommittee, the Brown County Housing Advocacy Fellowship, for individuals with lived experience

The task forces' goal is to meet monthly to discuss new findings to continue and advance progress towards current initiatives.

We aim to educate ourselves and the public on these systemic justice problems and to enact change in our government to reflect what is needed for the most marginalized members of our society.

This may include city and county resolutions, networking with other leaders, and get out the vote campaigns.
