





2007 Recipient JOSHUA Spirit of Leadership Award

JOSHUA is pleased to present the 2007 Spirit of Leadership Award to Fr. Ken De Groot for his tireless and courageous efforts on behalf of the Hispanic immigrant community in Brown County. As pastor of St. Willebrord parish, Fr. Ken and his pastoral team not only attend to the needs of an English speaking community and a Hispanic community, but also promote dialogue and collaboration between the two. Fr. Ken also regularly visits the Brown County Jail where he leads services in Spanish.

To deepen his understanding of Hispanic immigrant families, Fr. Ken has made several visits to areas of Mexico from which his parishioners have come. He has welcomed and promoted civic, legal and health programs (among others) which respond to the needs of the parishioners. And when the need or the opportunity arises, he is willing to speak out to local leaders about the dignity and rights of immigrants.

Fr. De Groot is a graduate of the old Central Catholic High School in Green Bay and a graduate of St. Norbert's College. In 1953 he entered the Norbertine order and was ordained a priest in 1961. He taught at Abbot Pennings High School until 1978. Fr. De Groot was pastor of St. Louis, in Dykesville until 1980 when he was transferred be pastor of St. Willebrord in Green Bay.

He has been active in the civic community including serving on the Mayor's Neighborhood Resource Board and the Mayor's Hispanic Advisory Board. He also has been on the Board of Directors as well as the Basic Needs Impact Board of the United Way.



The mission of Worldgoods is to promote fair, long-term economic development for artisans in some of the world's poorest nations, and to stimulate cultural awareness and diversity education within our own community. To accomplish this mission, they have a small retail store, online store, and a lineup of educational presentations. You can also host a fair-trade fiesta or fundraiser at your home or church. The products sold are sweatshop and child labor free.

JOSHUA Issues and Events

Justice Organization Sharing Hope & United for Action (JOSHUA) is an interfaith coalition of faith communities joined together to bridge differences and focus on common values to address community concerns. Issues are approved by the JOSHUA Board of Directors and sub-committees meet regularly. Many of the past year's events were initiated and organized within member congregations. We are pleased to present the following pages which detail our very active year in review by topic.

Immigration

ON MAY 8, 2006 JOSHUA organized a forum on immigration for more than 200 people at Green Bay East High School. Voices of immigrants and other community members promoted deeper understanding of this very complex and emotion-filled issue.

IN JUNE 2006, JOSUE (JOSHUA's Spanish-speaking group) hosted an evening discussion in which newly-arrived immigrants and long-time residents compared the stories of their family's migration to Northeastern Wisconsin.

IN THE FALL OF 2006, JOSUE held a community meeting with the District Attorney and the Green Bay Police Chief to discuss relations between immigrants and law enforcement.

IN MAY 2007, JOSHUA and JOSUE members voiced concerns at two public hearings regarding a proposed city immigration ordinance. A JOSHUA statement was presented urging the city to pass a Resolution calling on the federal government

to create comprehensive, practical, and compassionate immigration policies. JOSHUA and JOSUE members also participated in a powerful "Journey of Hope" Interfaith Prayer Service hosted by St. Willebrord Church on behalf of the immigrants in Green Bay.


Community Circles of Support

JOSHUA assisted the Brown County Corrections Relations Board in launching Community Circles of Support for former offenders who are returning to the community after spending time in jail or prison. **IN NOVEMBER OF 2006,** St. Bernard's Catholic Parish sponsored a well-attended forum for those interested in Circles of Support. In early 2007, St. Matthew's Catholic Church hosted a training for more than 25 people interested in participating.

Treatment Instead of Prison (TIP)

JOSHUA, as part of the statewide WISDOM organization, has been an active participant in the TIP campaign which advocates for alternatives to incarceration for non-violent offenders, especially those suffering from addictions.

IN FEBRUARY 2007, JOSHUA (and JOSUE) members participated in the WISDOM Madison Action Day, visiting the offices of all the members of the state legislature from our region, to encourage their support for TIP. IN APRIL, JOSHUA members testified on behalf of TIP before the state legislature's Joint Committee on Finance. IN MAY JOSHUA'S TIP Committee testified before the Brown County Human Services Board to advocate for TIP programs in the County budget.

Housing

JOSHUA's Workforce Housing Task Force continues to work on creating mixed-income communities where people of various income levels can afford to buy a home. The Task Force is developing an informational video that will be ready for viewing in mid-2007.

JOSHUA has also been involved with issues of homelessness. **IN FEBRUARY, 2007**, JOSHUA member Charlie Burnham was asked by Mayor Jim Schmitt to co-chair the Mayor's Task Force to end chronic homelessness.





Mental Health Forum

IN OCTOBER, 2006, JOSHUA members successfully called for adequate funding for the Brown County Mental Health Center at the Brown County Human Services Committee budget hearing.



ON MARCH 13, 2007, JOSHUA sponsored "Falling Through the Cracks," a forum on mental health care in Brown County. The event, which explored the needs and the issues surrounding mental health, was attended by over 100 people, including several public officials.

IN SPRING 2007, JOSHUA submitted questionnaires to all the candidates for Brown County Executive, asking their views on all the issues mentioned above. All three candidates gave very thoughtful answers, which JOSHUA distributed widely to members of JOSHUA congregations.

Festival of Unity

The largest event of 2006-07 for JOSHUA was the **APRIL 22**—Festival of Unity. A diverse group of more than 525 people gathered at Notre Dame Academy. Film Director, Ruth Broyde-Sharone, spoke and showed her award-winning documentary, "God and Allah Need to Talk," a film for healing and

reconciliation. In addition, there were speakers, music, dancing, and international foods. During the reception nearly 200 people signed up for a variety of ways to continue fostering understanding among different cultures and religions in our community. On a recent weekend, two separate events brought a wide diversity of people together to achieve a common goal...


