1. To help low-income people complete their tax returns (Canada)

Through the <u>Community Volunteer Income Tax Program</u> (CVITP), community organizations run **free tax clinics** where volunteers complete tax returns for people with modest incomes and simple tax situations.

Grant for hosting free tax clinics

Who is it for? Community organizations that want to organize a free tax counter. You can check your eligibility <u>here</u>.

When to apply? From November 21 to December 31, 2022.

How to apply? By following the instructions on this page.

To become a volunteer at a free tax office

To find a free tax office in your area

There are free in-person or virtual tax clinics across Canada. Find one that meets your needs.

To verify your eligibility for the services offered at a free tax office

Do you need help completing your tax return? You may be <u>eligible</u> for the services offered at a free tax clinic if you have a modest income and a simple tax situation.

2. To promote work experience in another province (Canada)

The <u>Odyssey Language Assistant Program</u> is a bilingual, paid work experience that offers post-secondary candidates the opportunity to travel to another province or territory. Anglophone candidates can work in English in Quebec or New Brunswick. French-speaking candidates can work in French in a province other than their own.

Participants work 25 hours per week and receive a salary of \$25,000 for a nine-month term.

Who is it for? To be eligible, candidates must: have excellent language skills, both oral and written (proficiency must be as strong as if it were your first language) in either English or French; be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident of Canada (those studying in Canada on a student visa are not eligible); and have completed, by the start of your work term and within the last 10 years, at least one full year of postsecondary studies. Quebec candidates must have completed two years of college-level studies or one year of university. For studies outside of Canada, candidates must have completed at least one full year of postsecondary studies and will need to submit a formal assessment of their high school academic credentials as well as a transcript of post-secondary records.

When to apply? The deadline to apply is March 14, 2023. Think about applying now if you are interested.

How to apply? Eligible candidates can submit an application online. See the <u>Apply now</u> link on the Odyssey page for full instructions.

3. To organize an event or a festival (MRC Vallée-de-la-Gatineau) - Only in French

The <u>Events and Festivals Support</u>, offered through the *Politique de financement pour les événements et les festivals de la MRC Vallée-de-la-Gatineau*, supports events and festivals that will take place on the territory of the Vallée-de-la-Gatineau between January 1 and April 30, 2023.

Who is it for? To incorporated organizations, local municipalities, schools or school service centres, Indigenous communities. Private companies are not eligible.

When to apply? By November 25, 2022. Please note that there will be two other calls for projects under this policy, in March 2023 and August 2023, for events and festivals taking place between May 1 and December 31, 2023.

How to apply? Complete the <u>online request form</u> (in French) and follow the instructions at the bottom of the form.

4. To encourage the digital shift (Canada)

The <u>Canada Digital Adoption Program</u> was created to help small and medium-sized businesses realize their full potential through the adoption of digital technologies. Two components are offered: 1 – <u>Grow your business online</u> 2 – <u>Boost your business technology</u>. You could receive up to \$2,400 for developing your online business, and up to \$15,000 for improving your business technologies.

Who is it for? For owners of a small or medium-sized business.

When to apply? Now and anytime – there is no deadline at this time, but it is recommended that you submit your application as soon as possible.

How to apply? Check your eligibility and follow the directions here.

5. To host an intern (Canada & Fédération des chambres de commerce du Québec) - Only in French

To address the labour shortage, the <u>Accueillez un stagiaire</u> program provides wage subsidies and personalized coaching to integrate first-year interns as well as interns from under-represented groups.

Who is it for? Non-profit organizations and private sector companies. Check the <u>eligibility criteria</u>.

When to apply? From September 1st to December 15, 2022 and from January 1st to April 30, 2023.
