PASTOR'S MESSAGE

At the time I am writing this, Jamie Conniff of St. Patrick's has passed away. The funeral Mass and burial will be on Tuesday, October 14 at 10:30 AM. We will also have Mass and burial for Kathy Carlon on Friday, October 17 at 10:30 AM. Please keep Jamie and Kathy in your prayers. Please pray for the repose of their souls and for comfort for their loved ones.

Also, this week is MEA week so I will be starving to death on Thursday and Friday since there is no lunch. Just kidding...mostly. Actually, Kathy's funeral is scheduled for Friday, so I'll survive. I said before, one of the reasons I became a priest is because there is food at almost every Catholic event.

This Sunday we have the parable of the ten lepers. I think there are two interesting things about this parable. I will probably elaborate more on them in my homily. One, is the lepers are healed not right away, but "as they were going." They were healed as they were journeying to go show the priests that they had been healed. When they started to journey to go see the priests, they were not healed. They had to trust that they would be healed on the way. Too often, we don't start to do the will of God because we don't think we are ready or have the skills or equipment to do the task. As we said in seminary, "God doesn't call the equipped; He equips the call." We need to learn that if God calls us to do something, He will give us the means. I cannot tell you how many stories, even in modern times, about how a religious order that serves the poor would have nothing to give to the poor. Then they would receive a random phone call donating some food to them just in time. Again, we don't want to be foolish, but we do want to trust that God can do the extraordinary. We must be willing to take risks for God and for His Kingdom. We have to trust that if God is calling us, He will give us the means to accomplish the task.

The other interesting thing is it would appear that all ten were healed physically (of the disease of leprosy). However, only the one that came back and thanked Jesus, was healed not only
