## **PASTOR'S MESSAGE**

Guten Tag.

That's about the extent of my German. This past week, the St. Mary's community, and the larger Caledonia community, lost a cornerstone. Lois Schmitz passed away. Her funeral will be Monday, November 10 at 11 AM. Visitation will be Sunday from 3-7 PM and from 10:45 on Monday. Visitation will be in Holy Family Hall at St. Mary's Church. Please pray for the repose of her soul and for her family.

Father Ed McGrath is covering some Masses for me next weekend. He is a retired priest living in Preston. He will have the school Mass Friday morning. He will also have the weekend Masses. Please welcome him. The reason he is covering for me is because I will be in the Alexandria, Virginia area for a FOCUS (Fellowship Of Catholic University Students) recruitment weekend. I will be one of the spiritual directors for the weekend. Please pray for the young men and women who are discerning if God is calling them to commit to two years of evangelizing and inviting students on college campuses across the country to a deeper relationship with Christ.

This Sunday lands on the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. St. John Lateran Basilica is one of the four major basilicas in Rome. The others are St. Marv Major, St. Paul Outside the Wall, and of course, St. Peter's. Founded in AD 324, it is the oldest public church in the city of Rome and the oldest basilica in the Western world. St. John Lateran is the Catholic Cathedral of the Diocese of Rome. Since the 12th century, the dedication of St. John Lateran Basilica has been celebrated on November 9th. Hence, why we celebrate it today. Of course, my favorite major basilica in Rome is St. Peter's. But besides the obvious, my favorite of the other three major basilicas is St. John's Lateran. I think the size and beauty is just amazing. I think I have talked about this before. Someone can ask why the Church has such expensive and beautiful things.
