PASTOR'S MESSAGE

There are unfortunately no baptisms this weekend. No little souls to turn into adopted sons and daughters of God. However, Bart Schuchts will be at St. Mary's on Sunday (March 9) through Tuesday (March 11) evening. You are not going to want to miss him! I have heard Bart speak before and seen lives transformed by his words. He speaks so powerfully of God the Father's love for us and how the Holy Spirit can transform our lives for the better. If something in your soul has felt a little off lately, the Lord wants to change that. So come, even if it is only for one or two of the three nights.

Not much is happening this week...except the beginning of Lent. That means that this Wednesday (March 5) is Ash Wednesday. So, as we used to say at the Newman Center, get your ash to Mass. Our schedule will be: St. Mary's Mass at 8:30 AM preceded by the usual Holy Hour from 7:15-8:15 AM. Then we'll have Mass again at St. Mary's at 5:10 PM in the evening. St. Patrick's will have Mass at 7:00 PM.

As I'm sure I wrote about last year, there are days of fasting and abstaining (from meat) and days of abstaining. The days of fasting and abstaining are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The days of abstaining from meat are all Fridays in Lent.

In the Catholic Church, the guidelines for fasting are:

- One may eat one full meal and two smaller meals that together do not equal a full meal
- Eating between meals is not allowed, but drinking water, tea, and coffee is permitted
- Fasting should be done by those between the ages of 18 and 59, with the exception for those who are ill, pregnant, nursing, or have special dietary needs

In the Catholics Church, the guidelines for abstaining from meat are:

- All Catholics 14 and older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent
- Meat includes beef, pork, chicken, and other warm-blooded animals
- · Fish, eggs, dairy, and plant-based foods are allowed

This is not an exhaustive list, but four reasons why we fast and abstain are:

- 1. It helps us detach from worldly pleasures
- 2. It deepens our hunger for God
- 3. It strengthens our willpower against sin
- 4. It unites us with Christ's suffering

The purpose of Lent is the preparation of the believer for Easter through prayer, mortifying the flesh, repentance of sins, almsgiving, simple living, and self-denial. We carry out these hardships for forty days because that is how long Moses, Elijah, and Jesus spent in the desert. Usually deserts are places with low amounts of life. So we too simplify our lives during Lent. We try to focus on growth in our souls through external penances.

I pray you have a blessed Lent filled with small trials and penances that we can use to unite ourselves to the suffering of Christ on Cross. Then we will be prepared to celebrate Jesus resurrection to new life. We will be prepared because we too will have new life because of the sacrifices we've made during Lent.


Crucifixion Parish Lenten Retreat


Semcac Food Shelf
