In our second reading this weekend St. James says, "Indeed someone might say: You have faith and I have works. Demonstrate your faith to me without works, and I will demonstrate my faith to you from my works." St. James goes on to say that "faith without works is dead."

We always remember that God's love for all is a gift. We are not worthy of it and we cannot earn it. Our works are a response to the gift of God's love for us. God's love calls us to serve one another and to not respond is to deny God's love in our lives. Remember always that we do good works, loving and caring for one another, not so God will love us but so we live holy lives because God loves us!
