This week in Catholic History

Faced with an imposing enemy force, the prospect of defeat for Christian forces defending Spain seemed imminent. However, because of the entreaties of Pope Pius V for prayers of the Rosary, Christian forces were able to win the battle of Lepanto on **October 7**, **1571** and attributed victory to Mary. Because of this, Pius V declared this day the feast of "Our Lady of Victory," which has been renamed to "Our Lady of the Rosary".
