This week in Catholic History

Few artists in the Catholic tradition were actually better known and loved for their holiness than their artistic talent. This, however, was the case of the Dominican *Fra Angelico* (a nickname that meant "Angelic Friar"), who entered the religious community in **1417** despite already having gained prominence as a painter. He would go on to paint famous religious artwork like *The Virgin of the Annunciation*, the *San Marco altarpiece* in Florence, Italy, and numerous portraits of Saints. Fra Angelico has since been beatified in the Catholic Church.
