#### **PASTOR'S MESSAGE**

Hopefully your summer is progressing with lots of fun and relaxation.

This week I'll be gone at a family reunion in Chicago from Sunday to Wednesday. My oldest sister and her family from Berlin will be there as well as my youngest sister and her family from the Middle East. Also, there will be my other sister and her family and my brother and his family. There will be twenty people all together including my parents. It will be a gift to all get together.

Today Jesus teaches us about prayer. In the Gospel Jesus teaches His disciples the "Our Father." There is a church on this site called the Church of the Pater Noster. (Latin for "Our Father.") It is located just outside Jerusalem on the Mount of Olives. All over the church they have the "Our Father" in 140 different languages. I found the one in Korean when I was there. The "Our Father" is the perfect prayer. It recognizes who God is. It recognizes our need for Him. It recognizes that we are sinners. It recognizes that we need to forgive others just as God forgives us. It is the prayer directly given to us by Jesus.

Then Jesus talks about being persistent and hopeful in prayer. We always want to leave room for God's providence. However, we should be bold. We should ask for great things. Sometimes I think we buy into the secular notion that God doesn't perform miracles. I think sometimes we have the mindset that yes, maybe God performed miraculous healings in the Bible, but He doesn't do those sorts of things today. Myself included, we need to believe that our God is the creator of the universe and can choose to work outside the laws of physics any time He wants. life. I am constantly trying to become better at this. God's wants. We need to praise and worship God. We need to thank Him for His many gifts. But we also need to believe in Him enough to ask for miraculous things. So this week, praise and worship God, but when you petition Him, ask for great things. Maybe you have a long-term illness. Ask for healing. Maybe you know someone who has been away from the Church for decades. Pray that they will come back. Maybe you someone who is sick with cancer. Pray for a miraculous healing.
