PASTOR'S MESSAGE

The Christmas season continues. Hopefully the kids haven't gotten too crazy yet. Maybe for some of you Monday and sending the kids back to school can't come fast enough. Seriously, hopefully our young families have had a chance to rest and relax and enjoy each other's company. I think back on my first 15 years of life. So many great Christmas family memories. I'm still making Christmas memories, but they are very different now with all of my siblings having families of their own and all of us living all over the world. You probably don't need to hear it from me, but young families, treasure these times. I know sometimes it is not easy getting everyone moving in the same direction, but I promise you, it is worth it for the memories you are making now.

Today we celebrate Epiphany. Epiphany means a sudden realization or insight. There are so many ways that the visit of the magi is revelatory. The magi had been following the star west over a great distance. The star finally led them to Jerusalem. The magi had discerned that this was a very special star, a star that was leading them to a great king. From Jerusalem they make the eight and half mile hike down to Bethlehem. There they found the Holy Family. When they arrived, they gave Jesus interesting gifts. Gold, for Jesus' kingship. Frankincense for Jesus' priesthood. And myrrh for Jesus being the greatest prophet, the great revealer of God (because He is God). Jesus is the ultimate priest, prophet, and king. Do we proclaim the Truth of Jesus Christ to others? Do we partake in Christ's kingship? Do we inspire others to make Christ King of their lives by making Jesus first in our lives?

I pray as we celebrate Epiphany today and continue to celebrate the Christmas season that we remember to slow down and pay homage to Jesus and to thank Him for being our King; a King that loves us more than we can imagine.

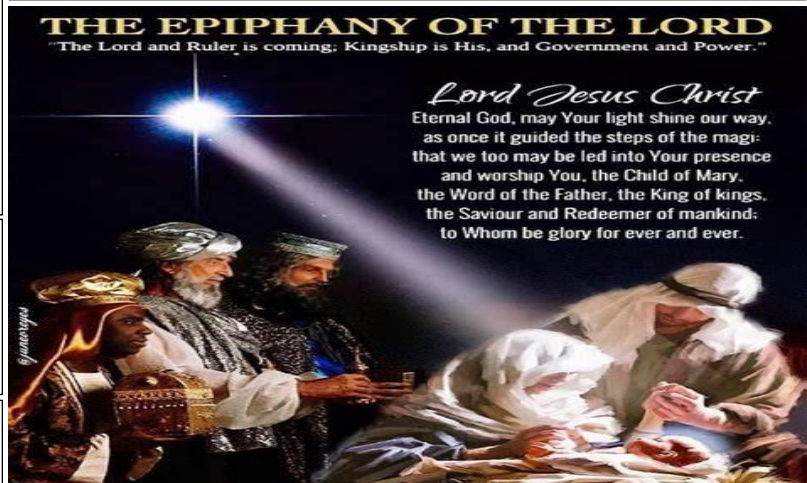

**What is the Meaning of "Epiphany"?**

While Christmas is centered on the birth of Jesus, Epiphany marks the moment of His revelation to the world. Epiphany means "appearance or manifestation." Throughout the world, Christians celebrate it 12 days after Christmas Day. Many countries refer to it as "Three Kings Day." On this day, Western Christianity recognizes Christ's manifestation to the Gentiles. The Gentiles were represented when The Magi visited the child Jesus and showed how God's gift of the Good News is for everyone. Since epiphany means manifestation, early celebrations honored any of the four manifestations of Christ. His birth, the adoration of the Magi, Jesus' baptism, and the first miracle at Cana, where Jesus turned water into wine.
