Human life is such a gift, an amazing gift from God. Thank you to all parents who said yes to life. Please pray for these kids and their families.

These things that you are doing...these are things that should just be expected of an average Christian. do." Again, we ideally obey God out of love rather than for a prize or a gift. Right. Sometimes we bargain with God. If I do this kind thing for someone, you will give me the new job I interviewed for. In some ways, this is okay. It may be a first step in growing in trust of God and His will for our lives. But it is not ideal. Again, ideally, we obey God out of love for him, because He is our heavenly Father. Are you in relationship with God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit? Are we seeking recognition for being a good person, a good Christian? Or are we doing the will of God in our lives out of love for God and our neighbor? I pray for me and you, that it is the latter.
