PASTOR'S MESSAGE

How do you know you are going in the right direction? Today we have Global Positioning System (GPS). However, in the time of Jesus, they used the sun, the moon, and the stars to navigate. Jesus says these guiding celestial bodies will no longer be available, but the Son of Man will be. This is so true of our lives. We try guide our lives by so many different things. However, Jesus wants and needs to be our guiding light. If we want to navigate the perils of life successfully, then we need God, we need Jesus Christ.

St Elizabeth was born in 1207, the daughter of the King of Hungary. At a very young age, she was married to a nobleman and gave birth to three daughters. Even while married, she dedicated herself to prayer and meditation. Her husband died, after which Elizabeth lived a life of poverty. She used her wealth to establish a hospital in which she herself took care of the sick. She died at the age of 24 years.
