PASTOR'S MESSAGE

This weekend we celebrate the 16th Sunday of Ordinary Time. We had an amazing time at Steubenville Rochester last weekend. Thank you for your prayers. I think all of our hearts grew in their capacity to receive God's love.

This Sunday (July 20), at 6:30 we are having a bonfire for the young adults on the rectory patio. So, if you are between the ages of 18-35. This week we also have a ton of young junior high kids going to Camp Summit. They will have Mass every day. A chance to go to Confession and adore Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. They will also challenge themselves on high ropes courses, archery, climbing wall. There will also be opportunities for Rosary making, ultimate frisbee, hiking, and extreme napping. We also have to high school kids going as camp counselors. So please keep them in your prayer this week as well. Pray that they too have a radical encounter with Christ and His love for them.

I will be gone Friday and Saturday as I have weddings in Mankato and Waseca. I will be back for Masses on Sunday (July 27) morning.

This week we hear about Martha and Mary. The time and place of the Gospels are very much an honor society. Reputation was everything. And how you treated guests was immensely important. So when Jesus shows up with His disciples at Martha and Marv's house, it would have been unthinkable not to serve them food and drink. However, Mary, doesn't move. She just sits at Jesus' feet, soaking in every word that comes from Jesus' mouth. In some sense Martha was right to get upset. It was Mary's house too and yet she was not helping Martha out at all. When Martha finally complains, Jesus tells her that she is anxious and worried...and that Marv's has chosen the better part. Notice Jesus does not tell her that Martha has chosen the bad part or the wrong part. No, treating guests, all people, with respect and dignity, and to serve others is very important. However, as Jesus says, His words will endure forever. So yes, we need to clean our house, we need to attend to guests, we need to attend to the duties of life. However, are we making soaking in the words of Jesus our highest priority? I know that I don't always put Jesus first in my life. I am constantly trying to become better at this. God's wants


