PASTOR'S MESSAGE

(taken from the MN Conference of Catholic Bishops) "The trial of Derek Chauvin, the former Minneapolis police officer accused of killing George Floyd last Spring, has reopened questions throughout Minnesota about the impact of racism in our society and culture. As leaders of the Catholic dioceses of our State – pastors of multi-racial, multi-cultural flocks from all walks of life - we acutely feel the anxieties in our communities, along with a thirst for justice and a longing for a path to a more peaceful life together as sons and daughters of God.

We wish to hold up before all peoples the image of the Crucified Christ. Jesus Christ gave his life to bring eternal justice, reconciliation, and salvation to all peoples. He teaches us that our own personal and communal violence and destruction will not bring healing.

Let us pray with one another and for one another. Let us respect one another as children of God."

Bishop Quinn talks about Returning to Mass

Bishop Quinn recently wrote: "As part of our gradual return to normalcy, I am inviting our Catholic community to reflect on their attendance and participation in the Eucharist, especially if a person is healthy and has resumed routine activities that are public and one in the presence of other people. I ask the question: if you are able to resume public activities, should you not be attending Mass? If you have an underlying health condition, please stay home and be safe. However, if there is not room for you at a Sunday Mass, you might consider going to Mass during the week.

If you are healthy and are able, I encourage you to return to the Eucharist out of love and not obligation, even now while the dispensation from Sunday Mass is still in effect. Blessed are you!"

New Protocols for Masses


