Palm Sunday is the final Sunday of Lent, the beginning of Holy Week, and commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ in Jerusalem, days before he was crucified. Known as such because the faithful will often receive palm fronds which they use to participate in the reenactment of Christ's arrival in Jerusalem. Palm branches are widely recognized symbol of peace and victory. Good Friday is the day on which Catholics commemorate the crucifixion of Jesus Christ. According to the gospels, Jesus was betrayed by Judas on the night of the Last Supper, commemorated on Holy Thursday, Good Friday is a day of fasting within the Church. Traditionally, there is no Mass (only a Service) and no celebration of the Eucharist.
