PASTOR'S MESSAGE

'Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions."

In this weekend's Gospel, Jesus is very clear that accumulation, greed, and excessive riches, are more of an obstacle to salvation than not. Why is this?

Practically, I think of growing up — My parents would often give my brother and I a modest allowance. We would do our chores, work around the house, (try to) obey our parents, and as a result, we would get a dollar or two per week. For a child, and even as a teenager, those dollars were **very** crucial — We could buy candy, toys, gadgets, and all sorts of items; we were dependent on the generosity of our parents. When I got my first job, however, and I started making my own money, I didn't need my parents to support me anymore. And if I'm being honest, I didn't think much of their generosity after I started making money myself, because I didn't 'need' them in a financial sense.

As we have jobs, make a living, and start to own things for ourselves (or maybe for our families), it can be very easy to start to live under the impression that "I" am the source of providence — Just meaning "I" am the one who provides for me. In a certain sense, this is true! But how often do we recognize **God** as the ultimate One who provides?

It can be easy to take for granted **just how much** we have, and the fact that all that we have been given has really been permitted, and in a certain sense provided by God. Especially when wealth is excessive, or when we are focused on possessions or greed, our eyes can be drawn toward all that earthly, and it becomes easier to lose sight of the One who is the **True** source of wealth, the **True** source of providence, and the One who has created us lovingly in the first place. May we always recognize and appreciate just how much our God has done for us.
