## **PASTOR'S MESSAGE**

Sorry. Same old story. I have been gone for 3 weekends in a row. I will be gone the next two weekends for a mission trip to Peru. The mission trip with through Fellowship of Catholic University Students (FOCUS). I will be traveling with students from North Dakota State University (NDSU) and Louisiana State University (LSU). There will be about 20 of us all together. I will be back late on Tuesday, July 16. Please pray for safe travels and pray that we the students have some lifechanging experiences. We will be in the southern city of Arequipa.

Starting in August, as the rumor mill has already let out of the bag, I will also be the pastor of St. Olaf in Mabel. This means I will be involved in the operation of St. Olaf and will attend their pastoral and finance council meetings. However, a priest from the seminary in Winona will come down and say Sunday Mass at 9 AM. The reason for this is Bishop Barron has decided not to merge St. Olaf at this time. He wants to re-evaluate things next summer.

Also starting in August, after discussions with the Pastoral Council and the staff, we are going to start distributing the Precious Blood. The Diocese of Winona-Rochester has allowed distribution of the Precious Blood for several years now. The main reason I have not implemented the Precious Blood before now is because of *Concomitance*. What is concomitance? Concomitance is the teaching that all of Jesus (Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity) is found in both species (the consecrated bread and consecrated wine). So when you just received Communion under one species, you still receive all of Jesus. Receiving the Eucharist under both species is a fuller expression of receiving Communion, but it is not necessary. When I was at the Newman Center, I had a staff person who was highly celiac. So we had an Andrew chalice. Before I distributed Communion to everyone else, Andrew would come up and just receive the Precious Blood. He could do this because, again, all of Jesus is found in each species. Besides the teaching of Concomitance, from at least the time of the Council of Trent (mid 1500's) to 1970 (after Vatican II), throughout the Church worldwide, only the Precious Body was

#### SAINT OF THE WEEK: St. Maria Goretti

Maria Goretti was born in 1890 to poor Italian parents. She was noted for her cheerfulness and the encouragement she gave her mother after her father died. In July 1902, was sitting mending a shirt when an 18 year old man, Alessandro, attempted to rape her. Maria resisted and Alessandro began to stab her several times. Maria survived for one day, during which she forgave Alessandro, who was sentenced to 30 years in prison. In 1947, Maria was declared blessed and in 1950 was canonized a saint. May all of us be inspired to imitate her purity and her willingness to forgive.

distributed. So traditionally, only the Precious Body was distributed. Also, kind of personally, since we have carpet in our churches, I am a little hesitant to distribute the Precious Blood. If the Precious Blood spills, it is hard to get all of the Precious Blood out of the carpet. Whenever we approach the Eucharist, we need to approach with great reverence. There are stories of saints dying while protecting the Eucharist from being desecrated. The Eucharist is the greatest gift we have on this side of heaven. It is Jesus, God, Himself. Each crumb of the Precious Body and every drop of the Precious Blood is more valuable than even gold. However, despite my reservations, the Pastoral Council believes it will be beneficial to the faith of our communities to receive the Eucharist under both species. Thus we are going to start distributing both species and see how it goes. We'll see you when I get back.
