PUBLIC CELEBRATION of the MASS at St. Patrick's

- The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains in effect until further notice.
- Those over age 65 and those with underlying health conditions will be strongly encouraged not to attend.
- Face masks must be worn and social distancing of six feet must be adhered to by those attending Mass.

MINISTRIES DURING COVID-19 PHASE II – At this time we are greatly limiting the number of people who are required to be in our churches. As a result, we are not utilizing Altar Servers, limiting the number of Eucharist Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC), and only using one Lector at each Mass.

Children's Lectionary will not be held during Sunday Mass until further notice.

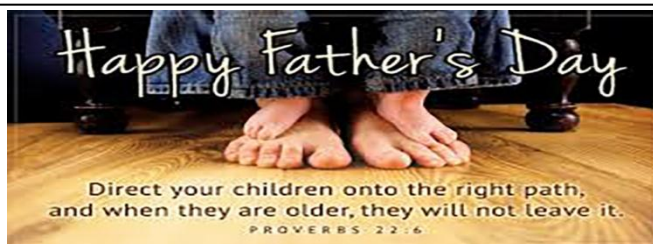

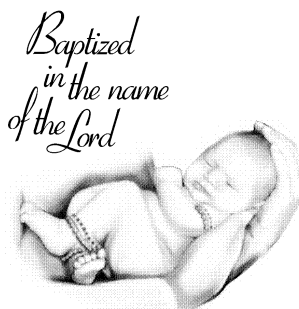
COVID-19 Website:

How long will we follow Phase II for Masses?

There is no pre-determined timeline for how long restrictions will be in place; further developments may allow for the loosening of restrictions or call for the tightening of restrictions. Phase II requires us to social distance and allow for no more than 25% of our Parishioners at Masses. Due to the numbers being relatively low right now, we have opened up the Thursday Mass at St. Patrick's to Crucifixion Parishioners.
