PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Monsignor Steven Kachel, pastor of St. Patrick's in Onalaska. writes, "Bringing Christ into the world is the calling of missionary discipleship. Mary was the first missionary disciple within the Church. She put her trust in God but also put that trust, that Faith into action. She immediately went to bring Christ into the world in her actions of love.

We are all called to missionary discipleship, that is to bring Christ into the world. By doing these actions we bring Christ into the world. Look at the first word of the works of mercy: Give food, bring water, welcome, clothe, visit, bury, instruct, counsel, admonish, bear patiently, forgive, comfort and pray. We don't have time to visit, we don't have time to pray, we don't instruct in the Faith, many now don't even pray for and bury the dead. Remember the opposite of love is not hate, it is complacency, not action."

Mission Work -- An interview with a Volunteer continued

Recently, Dan Hurley volunteered to help at Ft. McCoy for the recent settlement of Afghan refugees.

- **J:** Is this work something that will continue for some time?
- **D:** The missionary work was not intended to be long term, but it seems it will take some time still. One of the workers said that they are overwhelmed by the numbers. Supposedly, 100,000 Afghans nationwide are in need of refuge. Catholic Charities is working hard to get volunteer families, interview them, and check dwellings to see if adequate, then a background checks on volunteer families. This all takes time to complete.
- **J:** Tell us one or two experiences you had while you were at Ft. McCoy?
- **D:** There was one volleyball net for the whole campus. A young man asked me if there were anymore nets and balls. He had said that in the evenings hundreds of families gather and with only one net it's hard for everyone to participate. Barb and I purchased another net and took it to them. They were so appreciative! This was a baby step, but it was a start. I also took a bean bag toss set that my daughter, Sara, gave me. Big hit! Lots of kids can play this game. I'm looking for other ideas from people, such as rope for tug of war, or group games, low impact activities, etc. Any ideas or contributions would be great!
- **J:** What makes Missionary work so rewarding and would you recommend that others in our Parish consider also?
- **D:** There is nothing more humbling than helping someone after a storm in Winona, pour concrete by hand in Jamaica, or help with crowd control in Guatemala. Not everyone is appreciative. Some people have been stepped on so much they don't believe you are for real. But, you can't let that stop you. You need to get back up, brush your ego off and say Lord, give me another chance, another candidate, another wall to pour. Everyone should volunteer you don't have to go to Costa Rica. Barb, Sara, and I are going to help at Elsie's in Caledonia for the Thanksgiving Dinner. The Lion's Pork Roast Supper was just completed, Everyone volunteered and the group laughed and teased for hours and days!
