PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Just one more week. As I kind of explained last week, we did not celebrate Ascension Thursday in this diocese. Instead, we celebrate the Ascension today. This also means that next weekend we will celebrate Pentecost ... and thus the end of the Easter season.

This Sunday (June 1) the 10th graders in Caledonia are being Confirmed. Please pray for them. In a previous assignment, we surveyed some of the youth just three years after they were Confirmed, and only 1 out of the 7 was still going to Mass and practicing their Catholic faith. Confirmation is not Catholic graduation. It is not the end, but the beginning of a life spent in relationship with Jesus for the rest of their lives. Baptism is for us. We become a child of God. We are given saving grace in our souls. Original Sin is washed away. However, Confirmation is for everyone else. What I mean by this is Confirmation gives us the fulness of the Holy Spirit. We are given the boldness of the Apostles at Pentecost. We are given the fortitude and courage to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ to the world.

Again, today we celebrate the Ascension. We celebrate Jesus ascending into heaven to sit on the throne at the right hand of God the Father. In the Responsorial Psalm today, we say, "God mounts his throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord." Jesus takes His rightful place sitting on a throne in heaven. Jesus says He must ascend into heave so that He can send the Holy Spirit to be with the Apostles until the end of time. In the first reading the Apostles still don't quite get it. Jesus *is* going to establish a kingdom; however, Jesus is going to establish a *heavenly* kingdom.

Every day we are moving towards the Kingdom of Light or the Kingdom of Darkness. If we are striving to build our relationship with Jesus, then we are moving towards the Kingdom of Light, the Kingdom of Heaven, the Kingdom where Jesus sits on throne at the right hand of God the Father. If we are neglecting our relationship with Jesus, then we are moving towards the Kingdom of Darkness. Pray for me and I'll pray for you. Pray that we are moving towards the Kingdom of Heaven.



St. Patrick's Spring Fling is our annual large fundraiser that raises funds to assist in major repairs, replacements and needed church infrastructure. This last year, funds raised went to supplies to renovate two of the Rectory bedrooms and one bathroom, renovate the Church Hall bathrooms, purchase of chasubles worn by Father and Deacon, and to purchase supplies needed for Masses and Baptism's. Without the support of the many donors and volunteers, this event could not be successful! Here is a summary of our 2025 Spring Fling:

- 209 meals were served bringing in \$2,960. Net profit was \$1,965.61.
- Silent Auction had 48 donated items. Total bids \$1,505
- Jewelry Sales profit of \$83
- Children's games profit of \$189 -- funds will go directly to the Youth Programs.
- Bake Sale had a profit of \$864.00
- Quilt Raffle sold 167 tickets \$835
- Basket Raffles had 50 donated baskets. 709 tickets were • sold, profit was \$2,836
- Ticket Raffle ticket sales was \$5,839, with net profit at • \$5,419. 41 donations provided for the ticket winners, in addition to \$1,000 in cash prizes given out.
- Generous donations of money at \$1,800.00
- 47 volunteers participated in event preparations, during the event and/or for clean up!

Revenues: \$16,911.00 / Expenses: \$2,474.39 = Net \$14,436.61
