PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Hopefully you have had chances to get out of town. Hopefully you have started to create some summer memories. From some of my conversations it sounds like the kids are spending some good time at the pool. Growing up, we lived at the pool. We went almost every day. We also had to take swimming lessons. I can swim, but I think I'm the slowest swimmer in the world.

Another weekend, another baptism. Actually, we have two baptisms because we have twins. Otis and Ellie Snitker will be baptized after Mass at St. Mary's on Sunday (June 15). Otis and Ellie are children of Dan and Kayla. So, pray for them and their family. We pray they are immersed in the love of God.
