PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Salvete,

Hello (in Latin). This Sunday (January 18), we have Praise and Worship at 4 PM at St. Mary's. Please join Amber and others as we praise God with song. There will also be Adoration and Confessions available. There are so many different types of music. Some music is appropriate for Mass. Some music is not. There are some types of music that don't belong in Mass but are still very prayerful and help lift our souls to God. A lot of praise and worship music fall into this category. In my college years, praise and worship played a big part in growing my relationship with Jesus. In fact, I went to many, many Christian music concerts in my college days and early adulthood. I can't count the number of times I saw Newsboys. I also have seen Michael W. Smith, Point of Grace, Stephen Curtis Chapman, Audio Adrenaline, Jars of Clay, and many others in concert. If you know any of these people or bands, you get a gold star for the day. Sometimes it is helpful to listen to music that speaks to our current situation. However, I would encourage you to find music that draws you closer to Christ, that lifts you up from where you are. It doesn't have to be Christian music. However, music can be so powerful. After you listen to a song, do you feel more at peace? Do you feel closer to God and/or others? Do you feel more on fire to make the world a better place? Or do you feel more anger and bitter? Are you thinking lustful thoughts? The artist I currently bingeing on is Lucy Thomas. She is kind of unknown and hails from Wigan, Lancashire, England. Wow! This paragraph ended up a lot longer than I planned. Sorry, not sorry for the music rant.

Today, in the Gospel, we see John, the Baptist, give witness to Jesus Christ. "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world." This is almost exactly what we say at Mass. Jesus is the Lamb that was slaughtered for our sake. He was the Lamb who was sacrificed so that we may receive mercy instead of justice. John also makes it clear that even though Jesus was younger than him, Jesus, as God the Son, existed before him: "A man is coming after me who ranks ahead of me because he existed before me." John, here and elsewhere, shows that he knows he is not the main

event. Instead, his role is to prepare others to be ready for the main event. John's whole life is about pointing to Jesus. Our lives should do the same. Our lives should be about pointing people to Jesus.

I received an email recently from the diocese saying that Mass attendance is up in our diocese year over year. This follows what is going on nationwide and even internationally. However, at least in our diocese, we are not back to pre-COVID levels (of Mass attendance). So, it is still very much on Bishop Barron's heart, and mine, that we strive to invite others to come back to Mass. If we want to grow our parish community, this is the low hanging fruit. These are the ones who still love Jesus and the Catholic faith, but they have just gotten into the habit of not coming to Sunday Mass. All they may need is a gentle nudge or reminder. So, I'm encouraging all of you to think of one to three people you could gently invite to come back to Mass. Maybe invite them to sit with you and your family.
