PASTOR'S MESSAGE

As I'm sure I said last year, unless your tree is a fire hazard, your tree and the rest of your Christmas decorations should still be up. Christmas is a season, not just a day. My sister got married to a man who had roots in the Middle East. After their wedding in Iowa, they went to the Middle East and celebrated for like three days. If we look at weddings and other celebrations in the Bible, the celebrations lasted for days. So, our celebration of Christmas should last for days. This year the Christmas season lasts until January 11 when we celebrate the Baptism of Jesus.

This week I'll be gone. I have been asked to help out with a retreat for the Immaculate Heart Seminary. I'll be doing spiritual direction for the seminarians during their retreat at Broom Tree Retreat Center. Broom Tree is about an hour southwest of Sioux Falls. So, pray for me and the seminarians that we have a fruitful retreat.

Thus, I'll be gone on January 1st, which is the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. Since it is a Holy Day of Obligation, Father Marty Schaefer from the seminary will be coming down and offering Masses. We have 5:10 PM at St. Mary's and 7 PM at St. Patrick's on December 31st.

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. Even though Mary is the Immaculate Virgin and Jesus is the Second Person of the Trinity, Joseph has an irreplaceable role to play in the Holy Family. We each have an important role to play in our families. By living out our role in our family, we live out our role in society. The Catechism of the Catholic Church, in paragraph 2207 says, "The family is the original cell of social life. It is the natural society in which husband and wife are called to give themselves in love and in the gift of life. Authority, stability, and a life of relationships within the family constitute the foundations for freedom, security, and fraternity within society. The family is the community in which, from childhood, one can learn moral values, begin to honor God, and make good use of freedom. Family life is an initiation into life in society." I tell couples preparing for marriage, yes, take care of the kids, but once you
