PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Eucharistic People,

No baptisms (which makes me slightly sad) this week. Also, later on Sunday (June 22) there is youth grill out fundraiser in Caledonia to raise money for those going to Camp Summit. Remember Camp Summit is the Diocese of Winona-Rochester's junior adventure camp. In my humble opinion, it is awesome! So please support our youth in this endeavor.

As I said last week, I'm obviously gone this weekend. However, I will also be gone this week. Canon Law of the Catholic Church says that priests are to do at least a five day retreat every year. So later today I will be leaving to go to a priest retreat at Franciscan University in Steubenville, Ohio. I will be back in time for Mass next Saturday (June 28). That means that there are no daily Masses this week. Please pray that I have a fruitful retreat. Please pray that I'm drawn ever closer to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Fun facts, I went to minor seminary at Immaculate Heart of Mary in Winona and I went to major seminary at Sacred Heart in Detroit. I was ordained a transitional deacon on the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary and I was ordained a priest on the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ; or in Latin, Corpus (body) Christi (of Christ). Our Catholic truth that the bread and wine are transformed into the Body and Blood of Jesus is unique when compared to our Protestant brothers and sisters in Christ. Some Lutherans believe that their communion is the body and blood of Jesus, but what do they do after their service? They put the bread and wine back in the cupboard. They believe the bread and wine are spiritually the body and blood of Jesus, but after the service it goes back to being bread and wine. Whereas Catholics believe the bread and wine have been transformed into the Body and Blood of Jesus and cannot go back. So even though the appearance (accidents in philosophical terms) hasn't changed, the what-ness (form in philosophical terms) has changed from bread and wine to the body, blood, soul, and divinity of Jesus. Thus, we keep the transformed consecrated hosts in the tabernacle where we can worship Jesus' special presence in the Eucharist.

Continued from page -1-This is why praying in a Catholic church (anywhere in the world) is different than praying at home or out in nature. Yes, God is present anywhere, but He is present in a more substantial way in the consecrated hosts, thus in the tabernacle, and thus in every Catholic Church. We try to make Catholic Churches beautiful not because God needs it, but we need it. We need beauty in our churches to remind us that this is special sacred space; that is present here in way that He is not present anywhere else in the universe. If we take the time to reflect on what the Catholic Church says about the Eucharist, we realize that either it is the greatest lie that has ever been told and has lead billions of people in the last two thousand years to idol worship pieces of bread, or it is the greatest gift that has ever been given to humanity, that the Creator of the Universe loves us so much that He wants to not just be with us, but to become a part of us. Jesus took on our humanity so that we can take on His divinity. As I said last year, John, chapter 6, verse 54 says, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day."
