- **Note:** Members were encouraged to attend to vote on the slate of officers.

3. Approval of Minutes

- Motion: By Kelly Holtz to approve the minutes of the October 2025 board meeting.

- Vote: Passed unanimously.

4. Treasurer's Report

Stan Tonneson reported:

• **Previous Balance:** \$16,933.00

• Expenses: \$23 (Lunch: Corky Collier), \$258 Liberty Mutual Insurance for liability insurance.

• Income: \$250.00 from Bridgeton Harbor.

• Current Balance: \$16,902.01

5. Agency Reports

Portland Fire & Rescue (Sean Whalen)

- **Dinner Attendance:** The fire boat was scheduled to appear at Saturday's annual dinner around 5:30 PM, but was cancelled because it would be too dark to see at that hour.
- **Invasive Species:** Confirmed jet boats are not affected by milfoil, but prop boats are chopping it up.
- **Equipment Update:** The *David Campbell* fireboat has been retired and moved to Astoria for display. It will eventually be housed at the Maritime Museum.

Multnomah County Sheriff's Office / River Patrol (Jennifer Chiobaniashu)

- Ross Island Enforcement: A major operation was conducted last Wednesday to gather ~35 boats (approx. 15 inhabited) near Ross Island.
- **Strategy:** Working with the Governor's office, Mayor's office, and social services to move individuals along (5 nautical miles or into housing).
- Holgate Channel: Teams were out today identifying boats.
- **Recovery:** Noted one body recovery recently; overall fatality numbers are lower than average this year.

Department of State Lands (Josh Mulholland)

- Ross Island: DSL is collaborating with MCSO and the City on the ADV cleanup.
 Optimism was expressed regarding the involvement of social services and the Mayor's office.
- Cleanups: Ongoing work in Troutdale and lower Willamette/Columbia beaches.

- Lease Rules & Regs: The new rules will go to the State Land Board on December 9th, with implementation expected July 1st, 2026.
- Public Comment: Steve Harkins (JBMI) expressed frustration regarding DSL's delay in posting public comments/replies. Blake Helm (DSL) apologized for the communication breakdown.

Oregon State Marine Board (Phil Hudspeth)

- **Board Updates:** The Board welcomed two new members (Fiona Wylde and a representative from Central Oregon).
- **Statistics:** 152,000 boating registrations issued in 2024.
- **Fatalities:** 12 boating fatalities recorded year-to-date. **Zero** incidents involved motorized vessels; 11 of 12 victims were not wearing life jackets.
- Rulemaking: Other work on "Sleds" rules and a new petition for a "Slow No Wake" zone on Ana Reservoir is ongoing.

6. Committee Reports

- CRYA (Doug Romjue):
 - Annual meeting held at Columbia River Yacht Club.
 - o New Officers: Tracy Robinson (President), Jason Resch (VP).
 - Success: Funding granted by the Marine Board to State Parks for the Schwitter's Landing dock repairs.
- Vegetation Work Group (Rick Nelson):
 - Held a "Best Practices" meeting. No immediate solution found; the state currently classifies milfoil as natural grass (despite its invasive status) and provides no funding.
 - Kelly Holtz noted experiments by Karen and Chris Sampson (Sampson Built Solutions) for the Vancouver Fire Dept. regarding suction removal of milfoil.
 - Next Steps: Planning to contact a resource from East Multnomah County (Aquatic Insight) regarding water treatments.

7. Old Business

Industrial Environmental Overlay / Conservation Zones

 Discussion: The City of Portland is updating its mapping, including new conservation zones overlaid on industrial waterfront properties (partly driven by FEMA/NMFS biological opinions).

- **Impact:** Concerns raised that new "conservation" designations will make permitting for basic repairs (e.g., roads, transformers) significantly harder and more expensive after zoning changes are made in July.
- Action Item: The deadline for public comment is **Monday, November 10**. Quinn Flanigan and Justin Teutsch to coordinate a response/comment guide for members.

8. New Business

Donations

- Motion: Ron Schmidt proposed annual donations.
- Details:
 - 1. Christmas Ships: \$600
 - 2. **Nautical Safety Foundation:** \$600 (Noted they distribute ~1,600 life jackets/year).
