#### NEWS AND INFO FROM OUR GOVERNMENTAL ALLIES

#### Chris Castelli, Dept of State Lands (DSL)

The ADV working group has concluded its planning meetings. They have filed the recommendations from the task groups. Some policy changes are underway; they are updating rule-making and fees, including fill fee increases, yet to be released. Their next meeting is in July. They are currently working on seizure notices for several large vessels.

He is filling in for Alan Hanson who is attending a River Patrol Training. They will be working closely with DSL on the ADVAC program. They have some funds (\$400,000) to use before the end of the calendar year (December). They are tagging boats for removal.

Rick Nelson, The Islands Moorage asked a question about wake speed signage that needed a follow-up answer from last month.

Someone asked about a large derelict dock that was tied to their moorage.

Can it be removed utilizing those funds?

Phil Hudspeth will look into it. DSL will check their guidelines.

Ron Schmidt requests that WOOO have a large number of seats on the DSL rulemaking advisory committee.

#### Vessel registration inspections

Several River Patrol deputies were in attendance: Deputy Steve Bevens, Deputy Mark Rose, Deputy Jason Tyrus attended to answer questions re: boat inspections/registrations. They recently did some moorage dock walks to check the boat registrations, which caused some protocol concerns for some moorages. The River Patrol's funding sources are linked to registration fees.

If a boat is in the water, it must have a current registration, even if it is in your moorage. The River Patrol receives about \$100,000 from the OSMB. Compliance will determine funding amounts from the marine board.

Mark Birnbaum's suggestion is that individual moorages can create a specific date for moorage inspections, announcing to the owners that River

Patrol officers are coming to check on the registrations. This could stimulate compliance ahead of time.

Moorage harbormasters can survey the boats that need updating, can notify the owners, potentially saving them a \$165 citation.

The officers only issue citations to the boat's owner. The boat must be in the water. When you sell a vessel, you are required to send a change-of-ownership to the OSMB within thirty days.

#### **Motion** made by Ron Schmidt, and seconded:

WOOO will help support the MCSO in their boat registration efforts by supplying contact information of moorage name, email address and phone numbers to arrange access for moorage boat registration inspections.

The motion was discussed extensively. After a vote, the motion did not receive adequate votes to carry.

WOOO supports the River Patrol registration initiative, assistance can be provided by individual moorages, not by a WOOO mandate.

Marlon Bump: We support law enforcement, we want clear guidelines re: property rights and advance notice from law enforcement for visits.

#### MCSO Update continued:

They have done several boat recoveries.

A stabbing incident happened at the dock near the Tillikum Bridge. A floating home resident rescued a swimmer-in-distress at 6 AM by boat, bringing him to the shore. He was transported to the hospital by ambulance.
