FROST FREE DATES

Cedar City averages 135 frost free days. The average last spring frost date is May 20th. The average first fall freeze is October 5th.

WHEN TO PLANT

St. Patrick's Day plant once soil hits 40 degrees (any time after March 15th)

- •Cool Season Crops
- •Start warm season seed indoors

Earth Day plant once soil hits 50 degrees (any time after April 15th)

Seed Potatoes

Memorial Day plant once threat of frost has passed (average last frost date is May 20th)

•Warm Season Crops

Pioneer Day

•Second round of cool season crops for fall harvest

Labor Day

- •Onions for early spring harvest
- •Garlic for June/July harvest

TIPS & RESOURCES
