The Flight of "Phoenix"

One of the primary missions of The Inspired 24 is to prepare its members for spaceflight. On August 29, 2024, that mission was accomplished when <u>Dr. Eiman "Phoenix"</u> <u>Jahangir</u> successfully flew into space as a crew member with Blue Origin's New Shephard program (NS-26). **The I24 now has a designated astronaut on its roll-call!**

Phoenix's seat was secured through a raffle drawing by MoonDAO, an organization whose mission is to accelerate a multiplanetary future with an open platform to fund, collaborate and compete on challenges that get us closer to lunar settlement. Phoenix has also participated in analog astronaut missions and trained in various aspects of human spaceflight. This mission not only fulfills Phoenix's dream but also represents the I24's vision of making space accessible to everyone.

Member Spotlight! Holley "Grit" Bolinger



Grit's love for space began in her very early childhood with a book that depicted Neil Armstrong's footprints on the moon. Even though she was too young to read, she carried that book with her, everywhere she went.

Inspired by her father's stories of NASA, Grit began a life-long journey of dreaming about her turn to experience a "ride" into space. When she was in the third grade, Grit wrote an essay on Sally Ride, noting the struggles the astronaut endured from an early age and how she never gave up on her dreams, despite being encouraged to quit.

More than 25 years later, the connection between Grit and Ride was solidified. Like Sally Ride, Grit has also faced difficulties on her path, mainly due to a learning and mental health disability since birth.

Today, she promotes STEM Education and is an advocate for mental health awareness and education in hopes that her testimony and experiences will help others.



In addition to her outreach contributions, Grit came close to her dreams coming true, when she was encouraged by her father to apply for the "dearMoon" crew candidate selection. The project was a space tourism mission aimed at sending its founder, Yusaku Maezawa, and 8 civilian artists around the moon.

Grit made it to the 3rd round of selection (the project was eventually cancelled), but her life trajectory was officially set on a course for fulfillment. Today, you can find Grit behind a camera lens aimed at that Starship she once came close to boarding.

Now a freelance photographer, Grit documents launches and activity at the SpaceX Starbase Launch Facility. Her work is primarily performed from the Upper Deck of Raptor Roost & LabPadre's Lookout.



Grit was also one of the first I24 crew members for the CHaSE Spaceflight
Training at the University of Arizona's
Biosphere 2, in July 2023. She is also a member of the Analog Astronaut
Community, a graduate of SpaceKind, and participates in organizations such as, Space For Humanity, Mission Astro Access, and NASA's Citizen Scientist.
