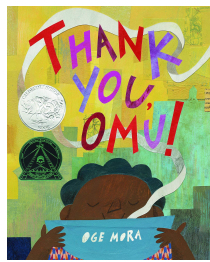
Antiracist Baby by Ibram X. Kendi | Bold art and playful text present nine easy steps for building a more equitable world.



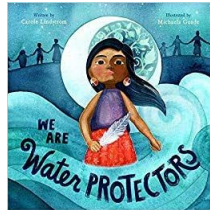
A Big Mooncake For Little Star by Grace Lin* | In this stunning, heartwarming story a little girl finds the mooncakes she bakes with her mama irresistible.



The Color Collector by Nicholas Solis | Gray illustrations gradually shift to vibrant color in this moving story about newness, friendship, and common ground.

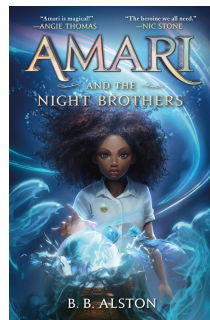


Thank You, Omu by Oge Mora* | Mixed media illustrations make this story about friendship, inclusivity, and community building sing.

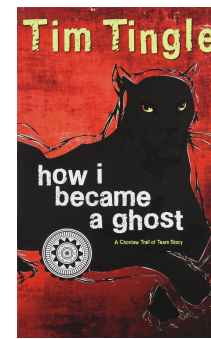

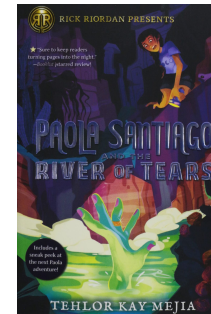

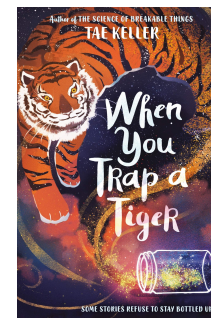
