1. Launching the pathway to permanent residence

The new Temporary Resident to Permanent Resident Pathway opened on May 6, 2021.

Candidates can apply for permanent residence through the pathway if they are

- international graduates who have completed eligible programs of study in Canada or
- temporary foreign workers in health care or in select essential occupations

To qualify, candidates must submit their application before November 5, 2021 or until the maximum numbers of applications is received, whichever comes first. We will accept up to

- 20,000 applications for temporary foreign workers in health care
- 30,000 applications for temporary foreign workers in selected essential occupations
- 40,000 applications for international students who graduated from a Canadian institution

To support Francophone immigration outside Quebec, and to add to the vitality of Francophone minority communities, there is no maximum number of applications for French-speaking or bilingual candidates.

2. Minister Bibeau launches the Youth Employment and Skills Program (YESP)

On May 5th, 2021, Minister of Agriculture and Agri-Food, the Honourable Marie-Claude Bibeau, and the Member of Parliament for Glengarry–Prescott–Russell, Francis Drouin, hosted a virtual event to announce an investment of up to \$21.4 million to enhance the Youth Employment and Skills Program (YESP) and fund about 2,000 jobs for youth in the agriculture sector.

The YESP aims to support agri-food employers and provide young Canadians between the ages of 15 and 30 with job experience in agriculture that could lead to a career working in the sector. In 2020, the Government of Canada invested \$9.2 million for the YESP, to fund nearly 1,000 jobs. You can find the live recording of the virtual event <u>HERE</u>.

3. Estimating Edible Surplus Food Survey- DEADLINE EXTENSION

Canada's commitment to reduce food waste and associated carbon emissions, coupled with recent events including the COVID-19 crisis and its impacts on the number of vulnerable Canadians requiring food supports, have placed increased emphasis on the importance of redistributing excess edible food. Second Harvest, Canada's largest food redistribution organization, has commissioned Value Chain Management International (VCMI) to identify the volume, types and potential sources of edible food.

4. The 2021 Census of Agriculture is now faster and easier to complete

This spring, all Canadian farm operators will be asked to complete the Census of Agriculture 2021 questionnaire. Data from the census will provide farm operators, farm organizations, policy makers, stakeholders and citizens with relevant information about the Canadian agricultural sector, and will help them make informed decisions regarding agricultural investments and practices in Canada.

Statistics Canada has made improvements to this year's online questionnaire, making it easier and faster to complete. Farmers can familiarize themselves with the questions by consulting the 2021 Census of Agriculture questionnaire. While some adjustments were made, most questions are identical to those asked in 2016. A letter will be sent to all farm operators in May 2021 with instructions on how to complete the questionnaire. All farm operators are required to participate and will have until the beginning of September 2021 to complete their questionnaire.
