As the food sector is deemed critical infrastructure and an important steward of fresh water resources, we would like to draw your attention to the Government of Canada's consultation on the Canada Water Agency. The discussion paper described below contains sections dedicated to issues and opportunities in agriculture and water infrastructure that may be of interest to you. The Discussion Paper presents key issues and opportunities for creating a Canada Water Agency, a number of which are linked to Canada's critical infrastructure sectors, for example, freshwater challenges in the agricultural sector and related issues involving the oil, gas, mining and manufacturing industries.
