Attorney General Marty Jackley wants to tackle election integrity

PIERRE — In Attorney General Marty Jackley's first address to the Senate Judiciary committee since he was elected in November, the highest law enforcement officer in South Dakota asked for two bills to be considered that tackle election integrity.

"If monies that are public tax dollars are inappropriately used for elections, I can't do anything about it," Jackley said when highlighting the election law exemptions. "We're just simply asking for that slight change to allow us to be able to prosecute crimes that the Legislature has already said there were crimes, but we just don't have an enforcement power."

The Illegal Test Decks

12-17B-5. Testing system before election--Public notice.

Not more than ten days prior to an election, the person in charge of the election shall conduct a test of the automatic tabulating equipment to ascertain that the equipment will correctly count the votes cast for all offices and on all measures. Public notice of the test shall be given at least forty-eight hours prior to the test by publication once in the official newspaper of the election jurisdiction. The test shall be open to the public. If any error is detected, the cause of the error shall be determined and corrected and an errorless count shall be made before the automatic tabulating equipment is approved.

8/13 Candidates on this test deck from Minnehaha in 2022 General Election have 0 votes selected....a clear violation...61% not tested...

SOS Admin Rules

-----Start of Rule-----

5:02:09:01.02. Test of tabulating equipment. The person in charge of the election shall conduct tests of the automatic tabulating equipment as required in SDCL 12-17B-5 and 12-17B-12. The tests shall be conducted by processing a preaudited group of ballots in a test deck marked to record a predetermined number of valid votes for each candidate and each measure. A tally sheet shall be created prior to the machine count to fully show how the sample of ballots is marked and what the machine vote totals must be to prove an errorless count. If more than one ballot is used in the election, a test deck shall be made for each ballot that is unique in any way. The test deck(s) shall include for each office and ballot question:

- (1) One or more ballots with a vote for each candidate and each side of a ballot question;
- (2) One or more ballots which have votes in excess of the number allowed by law for each office and question; and

- (3) One or more ballots which contain an undervote.

At least twenty-five test ballots shall be included in the total of all test decks. Individual test decks for individual ballots shall be of sufficient size to prove the accuracy of the system. If absentee ballots are to be received folded, at least ten percent of the test ballots in any individual test deck shall be similarly folded. The person conducting the test of the tabulating equipment shall date and sign the printout, verifying that the results of the machine's printed paper vote totals exactly match the tally sheet from which the sample of ballots was marked. The test deck(s), tally sheet, and signed printout must be secured and retained with the official ballots.

The test procedure shall include the processing of at least one ballot completely blank to verify that the machine is correctly configured according to SDCL 12-17B-13.1.

If more than one tabulating machine is to be used in the election, each machine shall be fully tested according to the ballot(s) which each machine will be used to count in the election.

In addition to these tests, any test deck may be processed any time before or after completion of the official count.

Hi Dan,

Yes, since we are a plain language state, and the statute reads as follows:

12-20-32. Preservation of ballot boxes and pollbooks--Delivery of pollbooks to county canvassing board--Violation as felony.

The county auditor shall keep the ballot boxes and pollbooks in the same condition as when received, until the meeting of the county canvassing board, when he shall deliver the pollbooks to such board. A violation of this section is a Class 6 felony.

In essence the Canvassing board only exists during the start of that meeting until the conclusion of that meeting, and the law is clear that the "shall deliver the pollbooks to such board." They are supposed to be able to scrutinize and validate the pollbooks as part of their agenda and process, they are not expected to have any additional hurdles or requirements. They are not supposed to ask, that they are to be delivered. Even the intent is clear by the very nature of the title...."**Delivery of pollbooks to county canvassing board--Violation as felony.**"

So let me know of a situation in a legal case, that a judge would accept evidence not presented in the chambers during a case...in essence the canvassing board is a group of people judging the election, they had no evidence of the pollbooks actually existed nor the work product, and did not have an opportunity to evaluate them under SOS Rules **5:02:17:14. Electronic pollbook security. (last line in rule)**

The electronic pollbook file may not be reopened prior to the official canvass. If the board of canvassers examines the electronic pollbook file, the board must check the audit trail of the electronic pollbook file prior to opening the file to determine that the file has not been accessed since the close of the polls.

The fact is they were supposed to be given the opportunity and they were not by default, and it caused them not to have an opportunity to examine the pollbooks....

Laws are laws, so if this is not enforced or removed by the legislature, it is easy to see why people feel that the laws don't matter.....and as an officer of the court you have a higher bar to maintain the rule of law.

In your own affidavit you highlight how Jenna clearly afforded them that opportunity, but you'd rather focus on the "delivery" to mean the physical location rather than the intent. It would be entirely different if the canvassing board requested the pollbooks and the auditor failed or refused to afford them that opportunity. That would be a failure to deliver. That obviously isn't the case here.

Here's what Cornell Law School defines it as:

Actual delivery means that the item is physically transferred from one party to another. Symbolic delivery occurs when something representing the transferred property is physically transferred. Constructive delivery occurs when the parties conduct themselves as if a transfer of property has occurred without an actual or symbolic transfer.

This matter came before the Board of Elections on January 23, 2023 on three Petitions for Declaratory Rulings submitted by Rick Weible to the Board of Elections. Linda Beal, Clerk moves to dismiss all three of Petitioner Rick Weible's Petitions dated Dec 6, 2022 for failure to request an action upon which the Board of Elections can act.

Having reviewed the three Petitions submitted by Rick Weible, and having considered the applicable law and administrative rules *Linda Heath-Vikon* hereby moves that the Board of Elections dismiss all three petitions based on the following:

9. The Board of Elections is not authorized under SDCL 1-26-15 to refer any matters to the Attorney General's office for prosecution.
10. The Board of Elections is not authorized under SDCL 1-26-15 to require a full recount of the ballots of the 2022 General Election in Minnehaha or Brookings counties.
11. The Board of Elections is not authorized under SDCL 1-26-15 to have new test decks created in Minnehaha or Brookings counties with each candidate on the ballot utilizing a unique number of votes cast from any other candidate on the test decks.
13. The Board of Elections is not authorized under SDCL 1-26-15 to investigate counties for compliance with SDCL 12-20-32.
14. The Board of Elections is not authorized under SDCL 1-26-15 to make recommendations to the legislature.
15. The Board of Elections is not authorized to require a recount under SDCL Chapter 12-21.

Other violations

12-4-37. Statewide voter registration file--County auditors to transmit changes to secretary.

The secretary of state shall establish a computerized system for maintaining and utilizing the voter registration file and transmitting voter registration information from each county auditor to the Office of the Secretary of State. Each county auditor shall transmit any changes to the master registration file or the absentee voter log to the secretary of state on a daily basis. The county auditor shall transmit updated information contained in the county voter registration system, including voter registration information and voter election history information, to the Office of the Secretary of State not later than July fifteenth after each primary election and December fifteenth after each general election.

Good afternoon,

The State Board of Elections should consider investigating what happened in the counties that could not finish the work in time, as required by law, and determine if fines, training, and or sanctions are in order for future non-compliance, via additional rule making or legislation. The Secretary of State's Office must also consider how you alert counties of their progress on a weekly basis after a primary or general election to avoid these issues. The following counties are grossly out of compliance with the law 12-4-37, of updating the voter histories and transmitting them to the Secretary of State's Office, by December 15, 2022: Beadle 83.2%, Buffalo 26.7%, Jackson 13.4%, Moody 23%, Stanley 21.8%, Todd 62.8%, and Tripp 46.4% completed. The data we are using is based upon the December 19th, 2022 from the SD SOS Voter History File.

This is important to those of us who look at election data, and it is a waste of money if the data is not complete based upon a statutory deadline, and we have to continue to make additional purchases and piece together data sets.

And it is for this reason, I am asking for a credit to be issued for a future database, when the data is complete from the counties.

Other violations – SD SOS

12-27-22. Persons and entities required to submit campaign finance disclosure statements--Violation as misdemeanor.

A campaign finance disclosure statement shall be submitted to the secretary of state. The treasurer of each:

- (1) Candidate or candidate campaign committee for any statewide office shall file a pre-primary, pre-general, year-end, and, if applicable, supplemental report and amendments in even numbered years. In odd numbered years shall file a year-end and, if applicable, amendments. A termination report may be submitted at any time;
- (2) All candidates running for a legislative or county office with a recognized political party shall file a pre-primary report if there is any primary race for that particular office in the legislative district or county, and all candidates or candidate campaign committees for a legislative or county office shall file a pre-general, year-end and, if applicable, supplemental report and amendments in even numbered years. A termination report may be submitted at any time;
- (3) Statewide political action committee shall file a pre-primary, pre-general, year-end, and, if applicable, supplemental report and amendments in even numbered years. In odd numbered years shall file a year-end or, if applicable, amendments. A termination report may be submitted at any time;
- (4) Statewide political party shall file a pre-primary, pre-general, year-end and, if applicable, supplemental report and amendments in even numbered years. In odd numbered years shall file a year-end or amendments, if applicable. A termination report may be submitted at any time. A political party that loses its status as a qualified party shall file a termination statement by 5:00 p.m. central time the last Friday in January following the calendar year in which qualified party status was lost;
- (5) County political party and auxiliary organization shall file a pre-general and, if applicable, supplemental report and amendments in even numbered years. A termination report may be submitted at any time; and
- (6) Statewide ballot question committee shall file a pre-primary, pre-general, year-end and, if applicable, supplemental report and amendments in even numbered years. In odd numbered years shall file a year-end and, if applicable, amendments. A termination report may be submitted at any time. If a statewide ballot question committee does not list any activity on the next required campaign finance report submitted to the secretary of state, that committee has until the next reporting period to report activity. If that committee does not have any activity to report by the next reporting period, the committee shall submit a termination report by that reporting period deadline.

A campaign finance disclosure statement shall be submitted to the secretary of state by the treasurer of each committee who shall file the following financial disclosure reports in accordance with the time frames stated in this chapter: pre-primary, pre-general, year-end, amendment, supplemental, and a termination when a committee is terminating its existence.

A violation of this section is a Class 2 misdemeanor. A subsequent offense within a calendar year is a Class 1 misdemeanor.

Other violations

PRE-GENERAL DUE: OCTOBER 24, 2022

- **Deadline:** Fifteen days prior to the general election.
- **What needs to be reported:** All transactions from May 22, 2022 (or last submitted report) through October 19, 2022.
- **Who files:** ALL statewide candidates and elected officials, ALL legislative candidates & campaign committees, statewide political action committees, statewide political parties, county political parties, statewide ballot question committee and ALL county candidates & campaign committees (in counties over 10,000 population; file with County Auditor).
