# Ballot Styles/Types

## Notes:

- 1) When this ballot style is inserted into the tabulator, it is reading the ovals. These are based on their position (coordinates).
- 2) Partisan and non-partisan ballots are unique ballots and are different styles from each other. This typically creates 3 ballot styles, Democrat, Republican, and Non-Partisan ballots all having different positioning (coordinates) of the candidates.
- 3) Each precinct is a separate ballot style, be aware, if there is a split precinct, due to a legislative or school district split, that creates additional ballot styles for that precinct.
- 4) Each contest option, must be robustly tested to ensure proper translation from the coordinate position of the oval to contest.
- 5) If using a both preprinted and ballot on demand printer, you must test those as separate styles, since printing output may vary.

## Notes:

- 1) When this ballot style is inserted into the tabulator, it is reading the bar codes, not the text.
- 2) Partisan ballots have no effect in creating a different ballot style, since it is not reliant on coordinates, it is reliant only on the bar code.
- 3) Each precinct is a separate ballot style, since the precinct is listed at the top main bar code.
- 4) Each contest option, must be robustly tested to ensure proper translation from bar code to contest.



# WI Statutes 5.84

**Testing of equipment; requirements for programs and ballots. (1)** Where any municipality employs an electronic voting system which utilizes automatic tabulating equipment, either at the polling place or at a central counting location, the municipal clerk shall, on any day not more than 10 days prior to the election day on which the equipment is to be utilized, have the equipment tested to ascertain that it will correctly count the votes cast for all offices and on all measures. Public notice of the time and place of the test shall be given by the clerk at least 48 hours prior to the test by publication of a class 1 notice under ch. 985 in one or more newspapers published within the municipality if a newspaper is published therein, otherwise in a newspaper of general circulation therein. The test shall be open to the public. The test shall be conducted by processing a preaudited group of ballots so marked as to record a predetermined number of valid votes for each candidate and on each referendum. The test shall include for each office one or more ballots which have votes in excess of the number allowed by law and, for a partisan primary election, one or more ballots which have votes cast for candidates of more than one recognized political party, in order to test the ability of the automatic tabulating equipment to reject such votes. If any error is detected, the municipal clerk shall ascertain the cause and correct the error. The clerk shall make an errorless count before the automatic tabulating equipment is approved by the clerk for use in the election.



# WI Statutes 5.84

- 1) **Testing of equipment; requirements for programs and ballots.** (1) Where any municipality employs an The municipal clerk shall, **on any day not more than 10 days prior** to the election day on which the equipment is to be utilized, have the equipment tested to ascertain that it will correctly count the votes cast for all offices and on all measures.
- 2) **Public notice** of the time and place of the test shall be given by the clerk at least **48 hours prior to the test** by publication of a class 1 notice under ch. 985 in one or more newspapers published within the municipality if a newspaper is published therein, otherwise in a newspaper of general circulation therein.
- 3) **The test shall be open to the public.**
- 4) The test shall be conducted by processing a preaudited group of ballots so marked as to record a **predetermined number of valid votes for each candidate and on each referendum.**
- 5) The test shall include for **each office one or more ballots** which have **votes in excess** of the number allowed by law and, for a partisan primary election, one or more ballots which have votes cast for candidates of more than one recognized political party, in order to test the ability of the automatic tabulating equipment to **reject such votes.**
- 6) If any error is detected, the municipal clerk shall ascertain the cause and correct the error.
- 7) The clerk shall make an errorless count before the automatic tabulating equipment is approved by the clerk for use in the election.
